Sin Spread to People Genesis 4-5

Family Discussion Starters:

- When do you feel angry?
- How does God help you overcome sin?
- Who else can help you resist sin?

Family Activity:

Encourage your kids to talk about the things they find (or would find) most enjoyable about having a sibling. Discuss ways having a sibling can be difficult. Share stories about your own childhood and experience with siblings. End with a time of affirmation, reminding each member of the family of your and God's love.

BIBLE STORY SUMMARY:

- Adam and Eve had two sons:
- Cain and Abel. Both made offerings to God,
- but only Abel's pleased God.
- Cain grew angry, and God
- warned him about sin.
- Cain killed Abel.
- God sent Cain away but marked him so no one would kill him.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

KEY PASSAGE: Romans 3:23

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

SIN SPREAD TO PEOPLE Genesis 4-5

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO SIN? TO SIN IS TO THINK, SAY, OR BEHAVE IN ANY WAY THAT GOES AGAINST GOD AND HIS COMMANDS.

Adam and Eve had two sons, Cain and Abel. One day, Cain gave God an offering of some of the produce he grew. Abel gave God some of the firstborn of his flock. God accepted Abel's offering, but He did not accept Cain's offering.

Cain was furious. Cain invited Abel to go out into the field. While they were in the field, Cain killed his brother.

Then God asked Cain, "Where is your brother Abel?"

"I don't know," said Cain. "Is it my job to look after him?" But God know what had hannaned God nunished Cain Go

But God knew what had happened. God punished Cain. God said Cain would spend the rest of his life wandering the earth. God put a mark on Cain to protect him so that whoever found him would not kill him. Then Cain left the land. He had a wife and a family, but they did not follow God.

God gave Adam and Eve another son, Seth. Seth grew up and had a family too. Around this time, Adam's descendants in Seth's family began to call on the name of the Lord.

Christ Connection: Adam and Eve's sin and its consequences spread to all of their descendants. But God did not forget His promise to send a Rescuer. At just the right time, God would send His Son to save sinners.

THE GOD'S PLAN for US

The gospel is the good news, the message about Christ, the kingdom of God, and salvation. Use these prompts to share the gospel with your kids.



GOD RULES. Ask: "Who is in charge at home?" Explain that because God created everything, He is in charge of everything. Read Revelation 4:11.



WE SINNED. Ask: "Have you ever done something wrong?" Tell kids that everyone sins, or disobeys God. Our sin separates us from God. Read Romans 3:23.



GOD PROVIDED. Explain that God is holy and must punish sin. God sent His Son, Jesus, to take the punishment we deserve. Read John 3:16.



JESUS GIVES. Ask: "What is the best gift you've ever received?" Say that Jesus took our punishment for sin by giving His life, and He gives us His righteousness. God sees us as if we lived the perfect life Jesus lived. This is the best gift ever! Read 2 Corinthians 5:21.



WE RESPOND. Explain that everyone has a choice to make. Ask: "Will you trust Jesus as your Savior and Lord? You can turn from self and sin and turn to Jesus." Read Romans 10:9-10.
