Two activities related to what your family is talking about are suggested each week. One activity is for your family to enjoy the other is for your family to serve in some way as you live out the gospel in your community.




Circle Gifts

KEY PASSAGE: Psalm 135:5-6


BIG PICTURE QUESTION:


Who is in control of everything? God is in control of everything in heaven and on earth.

MELCHIZEDEK BLESSED ABRAHAM

Genesis 14; Hebrews 5; 7

WHO IS IN CONTROL OF EVERYTHING? GOD IS IN CONTROL OF EVERYTHING IN HEAVEN AND ON EARTH. NOTHING IS OUTSIDE OF GOD'S GOOD PLAN.

God had chosen Abraham to be the father of a large family—a great nation through whom God would bless the entire world. Abraham obeyed God's call to go to a new land. He left his home with his wife Sarah, his nephew Lot, and all of his possessions and servants. They traveled to the land of Canaan.

God reminded Abraham of His promise. Abraham and Lot moved throughout the land. Lot chose where he would live near a city called Sodom, and Abraham went to Hebron.

In those days, four kings in the area got together and fought a war against five other kings. In the end, the four kings won against the five. Their armies took everything from the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah. The kings even captured Lot.

One survivor found Abraham and told him what happened. Abraham's small army attacked the kings and their armies at night, defeated them, and chased them off.

When Abraham returned from the battle, Melchizedek—a priest to God Most High—blessed Abraham Then Abraham gave Melchizedek a gift: one-tenth of everything he had.

Christ Connection: Melchizedek means "king of righteousness." Melchizedek reminds us of Jesus, an even greater priest and king who lives forever. Jesus died on the cross and rose again to bless all who trust in Him by providing forgiveness and eternal life.

GOD'S PLAN for US

The gospel is the good news, the message about Christ, the kingdom of God, and salvation. Use these prompts to share the gospel with your kids.



GOD RULES. Ask: "Who is in charge at home?" Explain that because God created everything, He is in charge of everything. Read Revelation 4:11.



WE SINNED. Ask: "Have you ever done something wrong?" Tell kids that everyone sins, or disobeys God. Our sin separates us from God. Read Romans 3:23.



GOD PROVIDED. Explain that God is holy and must punish sin. God sent His Son, Jesus, to take the punishment we deserve. Read John 3:16.



JESUS GIVES. Ask: "What is the best gift you've ever received?" Say that Jesus took our punishment for sin by giving His life, and He gives us His righteousness. God sees us as if we lived the perfect life Jesus lived. This is the best gift ever! Read 2 Corinthians 5:21.



WE RESPOND. Explain that everyone has a choice to make. Ask: "Will you trust Jesus as your Savior and Lord? You can turn from self and sin and turn to Jesus." Read Romans 10:9-10.
