

1. Looking back over the entire Joshua series, what moment or story has impacted you the most and why? Why do you think final words (like Joshua's) often carry such weight and urgency?
2. Read Joshua 23:1-5 and Joshua 24:1-13 — **Remember What God Has Done.**
 - a. What stands out to you about the repeated language in Joshua 24 (“I took... I sent... I brought”)? Why is it significant that the people personally witnessed what God had done?
 - b. Why are we so prone to forget what God has done in our lives? What happens to our faith when we start taking credit for what only God can do?
 - c. How does remembering God's past faithfulness strengthen our present trust? What are specific ways God has been faithful in your life that you need to remember right now?
3. Read Joshua 23:6-16 — **Beware of Drifting Away.**
 - a. What commands does Joshua give to help prevent spiritual drift? What do the phrases “snares,” “whips,” and “thorns” reveal about the consequences of compromise?
 - b. Why is spiritual drift often subtle rather than sudden? What are some modern-day “quiet compromises” that can slowly pull believers away from God?
 - c. Why must you be careful to not fall for the lie that you are immune from spiritual drift? What does it look like practically for you to “hold fast to the Lord” in your daily life?
4. Read Joshua 24:14-33 — **Choose Who You Will Serve.**
 - a. What is significant about Joshua declaring, “As for me and my household...” before hearing others? Since we all serve something, what do our lives (time, priorities, decisions) reveal about who or what you truly serve?
 - b. Why is following Jesus not something we can do casually or halfway? Why is it dangerous to make emotional commitments to God without first counting the cost?
 - c. Why does Joshua's challenge (“You are not able to serve the Lord”) ultimately reveal our inability to be perfectly devoted on our own? How does the gospel change our motivation from serving God to earn acceptance to serving God because we are already accepted?
