1. Why must hard work be “a” mark and not the mark of a mature believer?
2. How do we reconcile God’s promised victory with the many years of war the Israelites had to struggle through? What does this teach us about God’s sovereignty and human responsibility?
3. What does Paul mean in 1 Cor. 15:10 that he worked harder than anyone, yet it was Christ working through him?

Read Joshua 11:9

4. Why would God ask Israel to destroy the very things that could’ve helped them in battle? What must we ultimately trust in?

Read Joshua 11:10-22

5. Why did God command the Israelites to viciously destroy Hazor? How might we apply this same principle in our fight against rebellion?
6. Paul says in Colossians to put to death sin, what does this look like in our daily habits and rhythms?
7. Joshua 11:20 says that God hardened their hearts, what does this mean and why must we use context to understand this verse correctly?
8. How do we reconcile the destruction of cities and people in Joshua in light of God being described as both holy & loving?

Read Joshua 11:23

9. What does a physical sabbath rest look like? What does it mean to truly rest in Christ?
