

1. Read Joshua 6:1-5 — **God Gives the Promise Before He Gives the Process.**
 - a. How does Verse 1 emphasize the impossibility of Israel’s situation from a human perspective? What does God’s use of past tense reveal about his perspective?
 - b. Why do you think God chose such an unusual and seemingly ineffective battle plan? Can you think of a time when God’s instructions didn’t align with your instincts?
 - c. Why is it often easier to trust God’s promises than to trust his process? How might obedience look different if you believed the victory from God was already secure?
2. Read Joshua 6:6-14 — **God Shapes Our Faith Through Repetitive Obedience.**
 - a. What do you think the people may have been tempted to feel during those six days? How does the placement of the ark shape Israel’s understanding of who is leading the battle?
 - b. Why is sustained obedience often more difficult than one-time obedience? What daily or weekly spiritual habits feel repetitive but may be forming your faith?
 - c. Why must we remember that God may be doing something in you even when nothing is changing around you? How does trusting God in seasons of apparent stagnation mature your dependence on him?
3. Read Joshua 6:15-27 — **God Reveals His Power When His People Respond in Faith.**
 - a. What stood out to you regarding the walls falling and the conquest of Jericho? What does the command to devote the city to the Lord teach us about God’s ownership of victory?
 - b. How can success in our lives tempt us to shift trust from God to ourselves? Why must we remember that the Lord delivers victory in his timing for his glory?
 - c. How does Hebrews 10:36 help reframe seasons of waiting and endurance? Why do you think perseverance is often hardest right before breakthrough?
 - d. Where in your life does it feel like you’re on “day six” — faithfully obeying God, but tempted to stop because nothing seems to be changing? What would it look like for you to commit to one more “lap” of obedience instead of giving up?
