3. Why do you think it was important for Christ to be baptized?
4. Throughout these Chapters Jesus heals many people, why do you think he heals and performs miracles?

Mark 2

5. Referencing verse 7 many people believe Jesus is blasphemous. Why is this and why is Jesus' response in verse 9 and 10 so integral to our faith?
6. In verse 15, Jesus is at Levi's house. Who was with them? What does Jesus respond to the Pharisees with in verse 17?
7. What is the Sabbath, read verse 27-28? (hint: it's not a day to do nothing).

8. In Chapter 3 we see Jesus "break from normal traditions". Why might this "breaking of traditions" be integral to our view of Jesus?

Mark 4

9. We see several parables. Consider the "parable of the sower" verses 1-20, what are the 4 soil types and what is important for us to remember about them?

10. Throughout chapter 5 we see persistent and consistent faith as a theme. What does this teach us about our faith? What example does it set for us in the realm of persistent and consistent faith?
