2. What is the difference between forgiveness and justification? Why is it important we don't use those two words interchangeably?
3. Read Galatians 2:11-14 - **Justification is for all people**
 - a. Why do you think it's possible to know the Gospel clearly and still live inconsistent with it?
 - b. What are some ways that Christians today communicate that some people are "less acceptable" or "not good enough" for salvation?
 - c. Why would Paul publicly confront Peter? When is it acceptable to confront someone in the same way?
4. Galatians 2:15-16 - **Justification is through faith alone**
 - a. What are some modern ways that people rely on "works of the law" instead of faith alone?
 - b. If justification comes from faith alone, then how can we reconcile that with the truth of James 2:17-18?
5. Galatians 2:17-21 - **Justification creates something new**
 - a. What is the difference between "acting differently" and becoming a new creation?
 - b. What evidence is there when someone is living for the Lord and not for themselves?
 - c. How does understanding that salvation is for God's glory (not yours) change your motivation for obedience?
6. Who in your life needs to see a clearer reflection of Christ in you? What in your life needs to change for this to happen?
