

1. What examples of worship have you observed so far in the book of Joshua?
2. How would you define authentic worship? What might Psalm 95:6-7 look like in our everyday life?

Read Joshua 22:1-9 – A Call to Authentic Worship

3. Why does the motivation behind our worship matter (John 4:23)? How do resting and abiding in God affect our worship and daily walk?
4. Joshua was concerned about the spiritual health of the soldiers who were returning home, so he gives them a challenge in verse 5. When you have an opportunity to encourage/challenge someone, what would you tell them? Why?

Read Joshua 22:10-20 – A Misunderstanding About Genuine Worship

5. How would you describe the way Phinehas confronted the Transjordan tribes?
6. As Christians, why is it important that we seek to understand someone's motives when we are endeavoring to hold them accountable in love? How can we do this well?

Read Joshua 22:21-34 – A Response That Unifies Worship

7. How might the fact that the Transjordan tribes built the altar on the western side of the Jordan River support their claim that it was not an alternative site for sacrifices?
8. How did the tribes' response ultimately lead to unity, commitment and worship among the Israelites? What are some ways this type of response might benefit the witness of the Church in our culture?

What are some things that we worship with our lives? How can your group help you remain committed to worshipping God with every part of your life?
