2. Read Titus 3:1-2.
 - a. How does our obedience to governing authorities affect our ability to share the gospel?
 - b. How does being “ready to do whatever is good” improve the church’s reputation in the community?
 - c. How do our slanderous comments ruin our gospel witness?
 - d. How does being peaceable, considerate and gentle with others open doors for gospel opportunities? (See Colossians 4:5-6.)
3. Read Titus 3:3.
 - a. Why must we remember our former condition before we criticize the culture around us?
4. Read Titus 3:4-7.
 - a. How do these verses display the work of the Trinity (Father, Son & Spirit) in our lives?
 - b. How are these verses a perfect description of the gospel?
 - c. How does the truth of the gospel change our viewpoint from “us versus them” to “us equals them”?
5. Read Titus 3:8-11.
 - a. How does valuing the gospel above all else help us to filter through what is worth our time and what is a waste of time?
 - b. How are useless fights and divisive people a drain to the church’s mission?
6. Read Titus 3:12-15.
 - a. Why is the multiplication model of leadership shown here by Paul and Titus the best way to further the gospel?
 - b. Why must the church support mission work that is happening outside our community as well?
7. If we want to change the culture of our world, why is it vital we keep the gospel at the forefront of all that we do?
