

1 You shall not make idols for yourselves or erect an image or pillar, and you shall not set up a figured stone in your land to bow down to it, for I am the LORD your God. 2 You shall keep my Sabbaths and reverence my sanctuary. I am the Lord.

- V. 5 Your threshing shall last to the time of the grape harvest, and the grape harvest shall last to the time for sowing.
- V. 6 I will give peace to the land...and none shall make you afraid.
- V. 9 I will turn to you and make you fruitful and multiply you.
- V. 13 I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, that you should not be slaves. And I have broken the bars of your yoke and made you walk erect.

V. 44 Yet for all that, when they are in the land of their enemies, I will not spurn them, neither will I abhor them so as to destroy them utterly and break my covenant with them, for I am the LORD their God.
