she who conceived them has <u>acted shamefully</u>.

For she said, 'I will <u>go after my lovers</u>,

who give me <u>my bread</u> and <u>my water</u>,

<u>my wool</u> and <u>my flax</u>,

my oil and my drink.'

For their mother has <u>played the whore</u>; [adultery] she who conceived them has <u>acted shamefully</u>.

For she said, 'I will go after my lovers, [idols]

who give me my bread and my water,

[provision]

my wool and my flax,

[protection/covering]

my oil and my drink."

[pleasure/prosperity]5

# Turn & Talk:

When someone you love (a friend, spouse child, etc) is doing something harmful to themselves and/or others, how do you warn them or try to bring them back?

and I will build a wall against her,
so that she cannot find her paths.



She shall <u>pursue</u> <u>her lovers</u>
 but <u>not overtake</u> them,

and *she* shall *seek* them but shall *not find* them.

Then she shall say,

'I will <u>go and return</u> to <u>my</u> first husband, for it was <u>better</u> for <u>me</u> <u>then than now</u>.'

Hosea 2:7

8 And she *did not know* that it was I who *gave* her

the grain, the wine, and the oil, and who lavished on her silver and gold, which they used for Baal.

# Pause & Pray:

Are there <u>good things</u> in your life that you're <u>attributing to **others**</u> instead of <u>**God**</u>?

Are you valuing the gift itself more than the Giver?

Are you *using the gifts* from God in ways that **honor or defame** His name?

Therefore I will take back
my grain in its time,

and my wine in its season,

and I will take away

my wool and my flax,

which were to cover her nakedness.

10 Now I will uncover her lewdness

in the sight of *her lovers*,

and no one shall rescue her out of my hand.

#### 11 And I will put an end

to all *her* mirth,

12 And I will lay waste her vines and her fig trees,

will make them a forest,

and the beasts of the field shall devour them.

13 And I will *punish* her for

the feast days of the Baals

when she burned offerings to them

and adorned <u>herself</u> with <u>her</u> ring and jewelry,

and went after <u>her</u>lovers

and forgot me, declares the LORD.

14 "Therefore, **behold**, I will <u>allure her</u>,
and bring her into the wilderness,
and <u>speak tenderly</u> to her.

15 And there I will <u>give her her vineyards</u>

and make the Valley of Achor a door of hope.
