Discussion Questions:

- 1. The pastor emphasized the importance of knowing your identity in Christ. How does understanding your identity as a child of God impact your faith and expectations?
- 2. Bartimaeus cried out to Jesus despite others trying to silence him. Have you ever felt discouraged from expressing your faith? How can we cultivate boldness in our spiritual lives?
- 3. The sermon mentioned "casting away the garment" as a metaphor for letting go of old mindsets. What "garments" or limiting beliefs do you need to cast aside in your own life?
- 4. How does the concept of "say it, believe it, manifest" resonate with you? Can you share an experience where speaking faith led to a breakthrough?
- 5. The pastor stressed the power of personal praise and worship. How can we cultivate a

lifestyle of praise, even when we don't feel like it?

6. What areas of your life do you need to have greater expectations for God to move?

Practical Applications:

- 1. Daily Declarations: Write down 3-5 positive declarations based on your identity in Christ. Speak these out loud daily for the next week.
- 2. Praise Challenge: Set aside 10 minutes each day this week for uninterrupted praise and worship, regardless of circumstances.
- 3. Garment Casting: Identify one limiting belief or excuse you've been holding onto. Write it down on a piece of paper, then symbolically "cast it away" by tearing up the paper and disposing of it.
- 4. Faith Sharing: Practice sharing your faith expectation with at least one person this week, even if it feels uncomfortable.

5. Gratitude Journal: Each day, write down one way you've seen God's faithfulness, to build your expectation for future blessings.
