**AFTER THE CLEANOUT”  
What God Fills After You  
Finally Let Go**

## Sermon Summary:

This sermon concludes a series on spiritual hoarding by focusing on what happens after deliverance—not just what we remove from our lives, but what God replaces it with. The pastor emphasizes that God doesn't just clean our house to leave us empty; He fills us with His presence, peace, joy, and purpose. True deliverance isn't complete when something leaves—it's established when something holy takes its place. The message challenges believers to move beyond simply stopping bad habits and instead intentionally fill their lives with worship, prayer, obedience, and God's presence. Using the analogy of a hoarded house being cleaned, the sermon illustrates how God restores the purpose of every room in our spiritual lives, replacing trauma with healing, shame with identity, fear with faith, and bitterness with

forgiveness. The ultimate truth is that whatever God asks us to release, He already has something better to replace it with.

### Key Points:

- Deliverance is not complete when something leaves; it becomes established when something holy takes its place
- Salvation is not the absence of sin but the fullness of God's spirit
- A clean house is not enough if it is still empty —something will try to fill the void
- God doesn't just deliver us to leave us empty; He delivers us to fill us with His presence
- Freedom is not just the absence of bondage; freedom is the presence of God
- God restores the purpose of every room in our lives (mind for Christ's mind, heart for love, mouth for praise, spirit for worship)

- Whatever God asks you to release, He already has something better to replace it with
- In the Kingdom, surrender is not subtraction— it's exchange (pain for peace, guilt for grace, wounds for healing)
- God doesn't dress you according to where you've been; He dresses you according to where you're going
- The miracle flows into empty vessels— we must make room for God to work
