Sermon title: NOTHING CAN STOP THE BUILDER

Summary: The sermon explored the story of Nehemiah and the rebuilding of Jerusalem's walls, drawing powerful parallels to how God is rebuilding our identities, families, and purpose today. We learned that broken walls in Nehemiah's time represented exposure, disgrace, and a loss of security. But God called ordinary people—priests, farmers, blacksmiths, and women—to rebuild what seemed impossible. Similarly, God is calling us to rebuild areas in our lives that have been

torn down, reminding us that nothing can stop those who are called to build for His glory.

Takeaways:

- **Remember Your Identity:** The enemy's primary weapon is causing us to forget who we are in Christ. We are not defeated, depressed, or destroyed—we are chosen, anointed, and called by God. When we forget our identity, we settle for less than what God has for us.

- **Faith Requires Action:** Rebuilding isn't just about prayer; it requires us to put our hands to work. God doesn't call us to build without providing the resources we need. We must stop talking about change and start walking in faith, taking practical steps toward our destiny.

- **Unity is Our Strength:** Fear isolates, but unity protects. When we come together as the body of Christ—each person finding their part—nothing can penetrate our collective praise, worship, and work. The wall gets built

when everyone contributes,
regardless of their experience or
background.
