and the People Who Built It

WHEN GOD MAKES THE ENEMY GIVE IT BACK!

Sermon Summary: This powerful sermon focuses on God's faithfulness to restore everything the enemy has stolen from His people. Using the story of David and the Ark of the Covenant, the pastor

emphasizes that when God makes a promise, nothing stolen can remain in the enemy's hands. The message addresses feelings of defeat and loss, declaring that God will not only return what was taken but will add interest to it. The sermon challenges believers to maintain faith during seasons of delay, understanding that God is building pressure on the enemy while preparing His people for greater blessings. The key to receiving restoration is staying in spiritual alignment through praise, worship, and trust rather than complaining. This is a declaration of victory, not a "hold on" message, but an authoritative proclamation that God is making the enemy hand back everything that belongs to His children.

Key Points:

- God will make the enemy hand back what was stolen without stress or effort from you
- Whatever God has ordained for your life cannot remain stolen
- Delay is not denial; it's God building pressure on the enemy while preparing you for the blessing
- The enemy targets your purpose, peace, joy, and confidence, not just random attacks
- When the enemy holds what belongs to God's people, God turns their victory into pressure
- What was taken will be returned with interest, not empty-handed
- Complaining and negative attitudes delay the restoration God wants to give
- Separation from negative influences is sometimes necessary for spiritual breakthrough

- Alignment with God through praise and sacrifice releases Heaven's intervention
- You must talk to yourself and remind yourself of God's promises during difficult times
