**THE THINGS WE
REFUSE TO THROW
AWAY**

This sermon addresses the spiritual practice of holding onto things God has already delivered us from—old wounds, offenses, identities, and habits. Using the metaphor of hoarding, the pastor explains how believers often pick back up what God has removed from their lives, preventing them from moving forward into their divine purpose.

The message emphasizes that deliverance requires not just God's intervention but our active participation in refusing to return to what has been discarded. The sermon challenges believers to examine what they're protecting in their lives that actually needs to change, warning that the enemy often keeps us bound not through obvious attacks but through what we refuse to release. True freedom comes when we stop rebuilding what God is tearing down and allow Him to fill the empty spaces we create through obedience.

Key Points:

- **The enemy destroys us not always with the obvious but with what we refuse to throw away**
- **We are not defined by what happened to us or what was said about us**
- **What you keep entertaining will eventually influence you**
- **Eve fell not because the serpent appeared, but because she kept listening to a conversation God had already settled**
- **Death and life are in the power of the tongue, but it's not just what you say— it's what you believe**
- **Who you stay attached to determines where you stay; not every relationship is a blessing**
- **What worked for you in a previous season may not work for you now**
- **We want deliverance without discipline, freedom without fight, and victory without effort**

- **Faith without works is dead—God expects us to put forth effort while trusting Him**
- **You cannot pray for change while protecting what needs to change**
- **Stop helping the devil undo what God is trying to do**
- **What you permit will eventually possess you**
- **The level of your emptiness determines the level of your overflow**
- **Forgive but don't forget—release the offense without inviting the offender back to repeat it**
