

# DON'T FORGET

GOD HAS NOT CHANGED  
HIS MIND CONCERNING YOU



## Sermon Summary:

This sermon draws from the story of Job to encourage believers that God has not forgotten them nor changed His mind about their destiny, even in the midst of severe trials and suffering. The message emphasizes that waiting on God is essential, and that apparent defeat is actually

preparation for greater victory. Through Job's example, along with stories of Joseph and personal testimonies, the sermon illustrates that God allows trials not for destruction but for deliverance and double blessing. The central theme is maintaining faith and worship during difficult seasons, trusting that God is in control and working all things together for good.

### Key Points:

- God has not changed His mind concerning you, regardless of your current circumstances
- Waiting on God requires patience and trust, even when we cannot see, feel, or hear from Him

- The enemy's goal is destruction, but God's purpose is deliverance and restoration
- Job lost everything—family, wealth, health, and reputation—but continued to worship God
- God gave Job double for his trouble after his season of testing
- We are never truly defeated because the battle belongs to the Lord, not to us
- Surrendering to God daily is essential for receiving breakthrough
- Speaking life over situations, even when they appear dead, activates God's power
- Personal testimonies demonstrate God's faithfulness in healing, provision, and deliverance
- We must not give up or make foolish choices while waiting for God's timing

- Prayer and worship are powerful weapons that keep us connected to God's strength
