

Key Points:

- The battle belongs to God, not to us—we must learn to surrender control and trust His intervention
- Fear must be transformed into focus on God rather than on our circumstances
- Worship is a weapon that sets the atmosphere for victory and confuses our enemies
- Revival attracts spiritual resistance—doing the right thing will bring opposition
- We must stop fronting (pretending) and acknowledge our weakness so God's strength can be perfected
- Three divine instructions: Don't fear, stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord
- Position yourself in the right environment with people who praise God rather than complain

- What we allow into our atmosphere (music, words, thoughts) affects our spiritual victory
- God wants to demonstrate His power without our interference sometimes we need to stop touching what He's already handling
- Little becomes much when placed in the Master's hands with faith Scripture Reference:
 - 2 Chronicles 20:15-17 (primary passage)
 - Additional references to: God's strength being made perfect in weakness, vengeance belonging to God, being anxious for nothing, and being more than conquerors through Christ
