### I. A Hard Pill to Swallow - This sickness is for God's Glory

John 11:1-8 (NIV) <sup>1</sup>Now a man named Lazarus was sick. He was from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. <sup>2</sup> (This Mary, whose brother Lazarus now lay sick, was the same one who poured perfume on the Lord and wiped his feet with her hair.) <sup>3</sup> So the sisters sent word to Jesus, "Lord, the one you love is sick."

<sup>4</sup> When he heard this, Jesus said, "This sickness will not end in death. No, it is for God's glory so that God's Son may be glorified through

it." <sup>5</sup> Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. <sup>6</sup> So when he heard that Lazarus was sick, he stayed where he was two more days,

<sup>7</sup> and then he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea."

<sup>8</sup> "But Rabbi," they said, "a short while ago the Jews there tried to stone you, and yet you are going back?"

#### II. What Jesus Sees

John 11:9—11 (NIV) <sup>9</sup> Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours of daylight? Anyone who walks in the daytime will not stumble, for they see by this world's light. <sup>10</sup> It is when a person walks at night that they stumble, for they have no light."

<sup>11</sup> After he had said this, he went on to tell them, "**Our friend Lazarus** has fallen asleep; but I am going there to wake him up."

### III. Why John Writes

John 19:35 (NIV) <sup>35</sup> The man who saw it has given testimony, and his testimony is true. He knows that he tells the truth, and he testifies so **that you also may believe**.

## IV. An Amazing Example

#### Four Days Late

**John 11:17** (NIV) <sup>17</sup> On his arrival, Jesus found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days.

Where is your faith right now?

### • Death is Not That Big

John 11:25–26 (NIV) <sup>25</sup> Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; <sup>26</sup> and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

Eternal life is available now.

#### Jesus Embraces our Hurt

John 11:33–34; 39 (NIV) <sup>33</sup> When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in spirit and troubled. <sup>34</sup> "Where have you laid him?" he asked. ... <sup>39</sup> "Take away the stone," he said.

What's in the way of your miracle?

### Jesus Speaks

John 11:41—43 (NIV) <sup>41</sup> So they took away the stone. Then Jesus looked up and said, "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. <sup>42</sup> I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the people standing here, **that they may believe that you sent me.**" <sup>43</sup> When he had said this, Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!"
