Matthew 6:9-13 (NIV) 9 "This, then, is how you should pray:

"Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,

10 your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
11 Give us today our daily bread.

12 And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.

13 And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one, for yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

With this Model Prayer, Jesus is setting an example for us. Jesus is A) showing us a way to pray and B) encouraging us to pray that way.

What does this prayer show us about how to pray and/or not to pray?

Matthew 6:5 (NIV) **5** "And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full.

I. Simple. There is nothing complex or difficult in this prayer.

🔀 Simple <u>language</u>

Simple <u>requests</u>

Simple interaction


Prayer is just talking to a reasonable God in reasonable words about reasonable things. It is that simple.


II. Short. The Model Prayer is not long. It has only 66 words (NIV) and it takes only half a minute to recite.

Matthew 26:40 (NIV) **40** Then he returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. "Couldn't you men keep watch with me for one hour?" he asked Peter.

Prayer doesn't need to be longer than it needs to be. Sometimes it needs to be an hour. Other times it needs to be short.

III. Spiritual and Physical. Jesus made a combination of petitions and proclamations about both earthly things and heavenly things.





It isn't one or the other. Prayer is both spiritual and physical.

IV. Confident or Faithful. Jesus is not begging God for things He suspects He won't receive. He is asking for what He knows He already has.

Luke 11:11-13 (NIV) 11 "Which of you fathers, if your son asks for[f] a fish, will give him a snake instead? 12 Or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? 13 If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

Jesus is not desperate or doubting here. He is confident and faithful.

V. Plural. Jesus doesn't just pray this prayer for Himself. He prays it for everyone. The prayer uses *our*, not *my*.

Matthew 5:44 (NIV) **44** But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you,

Jesus prayed this prayer for everyone. He made it plural.

Prayer:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread.

And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one, for yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

I. Your Father Knows

Matthew 6:5—8 (NASB) Jesus on the poor and Prayer 5 "And when you pray, you are not to be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on the street corners so that they will be seen by people. Truly I say to you, they have their reward in full. 6 But as for you, when you pray, go into your inner room, close your door, and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you.

- **7** "And when you are praying, do not use thoughtless repetition as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard because of their many words. **8** So do not be like them; for your Father knows what you need before you ask Him.
- A. Your audience in prayer is only God the Father
- B. Mindless repetition is useless; God knows you

II. Jesus' Instruction on Prayer

Matthew 6:9-15 (NASB) 9 "Pray, then, in this way:

'Our Father, who is in heaven, Hallowed be Your name.

10 Your kingdom come.

Your will be done,

On earth as it is in heaven.

- 11 Give us this day our daily bread.
- 12 And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.
- 13 And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil."
- 14 For if you forgive *other* people for their offenses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. 15 But if you do not forgive *other* people, then your Father will not forgive your offenses.
- A. Identity and Position
- B. Welcome Heaven
- C. We need i) life, ii) forgiveness, iii) protection
- D. Relationally clean

III. Fasting and True Treasure

Matthew 6:16-21 (NASB) 16 "Now whenever you fast, do not make a gloomy face as the hypocrites do, for they distort their faces so that they will be noticed by people when they are fasting. Truly I say to you, they have their reward in full. 17 But as for you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, 18 so that your fasting will not be noticed by people but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you.

19 "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. 20 But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal; 21 for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Heaven is real and important, a safe place.
