- 6) Jesus had already healed this woman, yet he stops and turns around to personally engage her, even when he didn't need to. In today's world of automated emails, pre-recorded messages, and zoom calls, what is it about an in-person touchpoint that is so much more powerful?

- 7) We see Jesus on a mission to care for Jairus' daughter who is on her deathbed, but then he gets interrupted. How well do you handle interruptions in your work life, home life, etc.?
