Palm Sunday: riding on a donkey

Matthew 21:1-7 (NLT)

As Jesus and the disciples approached Jerusalem, they came to the town of Bethphage on the Mount of Olives. Jesus sent two of them on ahead. ² "Go into the village over there," He said. "As soon as you enter it, you will see a donkey tied there, with its colt beside it. Untie them and bring them to Me. ³ If anyone asks what you are doing, just say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will immediately let you take them."



Palm Sunday: riding on a donkey

Matthew 21:1-7 (NLT)

This took place to fulfill the prophecy that said,

⁵ "Tell the people of Jerusalem, 'Look, your King is coming to you. He is humble, riding on a donkey riding on a donkey's colt."



Palm Sunday: riding on a donkey

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Zechariah 9:9 (NLT)
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Rejoice, O people of Zion!
Shout in triumph, O people of Jerusalem!
Look, your King is coming to you.
He is righteous and victorious,
yet He is humble, riding on a donkey—
riding on a donkey's colt.

Palm Sunday: they took palm branches

Matthew 21:8-11 (NIV)

A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. ⁹ The crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted,

"Hosanna to the Son of David!"

"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

"Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

¹⁰ When Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred and asked, "Who is this?" ¹¹ The crowds answered, "This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee."



Palm Sunday: they took palm branches

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John 12:12-13 (NIV)
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The next day the great crowd that had come for the festival heard that Jesus was on His way to Jerusalem.

13 They took palm branches and went out to meet Him, shouting,

"Hosanna!" (Hebrew: "I beg you to save!" or "please deliver us!")

[They were not shouting Hallelujah: "Praise the Lord"]



Palm Sunday: they took palm branches

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"Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!"

"Blessed is the King of Israel!"



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*Palm branches (could) also represent Jesus being worthy as the High Priest for all who believe.

A palm tree takes 30 years to bear fruit and a man could not become a High Priest until he was 30 years old.

The ministry of Jesus began when he was 30 years old.

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Palm branches point to Jesus being Conqueror, King and High Priest

In ancient times it was not unusual when a king entered a city, he was greeted with the laying down of garments. It represented a physical manifestation of respect and submission to their king.

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By laying their "garments" down, the people were acknowledging Jesus as God's promised Messiah. They were declaring that Jesus was the one worthy to be called the "Lord of lords and King of kings".

Palm Sunday: the stones will cry out

Luke 19:37-40

(NIV)

When He came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen: 38 "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" ³⁹ Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!"40 "I tell you," He replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out."



Palm Sunday: the stones will cry out

Romans 8:19-22

(NLT)

For all creation is waiting eagerly for that future day when God will reveal who His children really are. ²⁰ Against its will, all creation was subjected to God's curse. But with eager hope, ²¹ the creation looks forward to the day when it will join God's children in glorious freedom from death and decay. ²² For we know that all creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time.

Palm Sunday: Above and Beyond

John 12:16 (NLT)

His disciples didn't understand at the time that this was a fulfillment of prophecy. But after Jesus entered into His glory, they remembered what had happened and realized that these things had been written about him.



Today we have the privilege of hindsight. We see what the disciples did not. We know the end of the story. And so, as we watch the events of Holy Week begin to unfold, We Come Alive to His life—ways that are Above and Beyond our own.

If you are here today wondering what this journey of Holy Week means for you, don't miss God's invitation.
