or why we Don't Follow Jesus

Columnist Dave Barry wrote...

"All of us are born with a set of instinctive fears—
of falling, of the dark, of lobsters,
of falling on lobsters in the dark, or
buying unassembled products from IKEA,
and of course, the words –
Some Assembly Required."

The Bible talks a lot about fear...

- The word fear is mentioned 266 times
- And the word afraid is mentioned 223 times
- The first time fear is mentioned is in Genesis 3:10 and the last time is Revelation 19:5
- In the New Testament there are actually 7 different Greek words that are translated as fear in the English language



We are quickly going to look at 3 of them.



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The first word is Phobeo

And it means: To be in awe of or to revere or respect something.

This is a natural fear.

In the Bible it is used for... the Fear of God, or fear of death.

Phobeo:



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Phobeo: is what keeps you from eating fire, or jumping off a 12 story building. This is not an unnatural or unhealthy fear. It's Natural... It's healthy



The next word is Phobos

And it means: exceedingly afraid ... or terror.

It's where we get our word *Phobia*

- If Phobeo is a natural fear, Phobos is an unnatural fear.
- If Phobeo is what keeps you from eating fire Then Phobos is what keeps you from being around fire at all.

This type of fear is a crippling fear, a paralyzing fear. It brings about a feeling of terror and dread in our lives.

He didn't use either one of these words -

Phobeo or Phobos

Or Why We Don't Follow Jesus

The word Paul used was **Deilia** (di-lee-ah)

• Which means: timid or fearful

•

- It actually comes from the Greek word... Deilos (di-los) Which means faithless.

And the context of this word:

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• Is being *fearful* to do things or... for that matter ... Even *to try* things.

Specifically here - the failure to do things for God.



If the first type of *fear*... "Phobeo" Keeps us *living*...

And the second type of *fear*... "Phobos" Keeps us *from living*...

This third type of *fear*... "Deilia"



If the first type of fear... "Phobeo" Keeps us living...

Keeps us from accomplishing things while we are living.

- This is the fear that makes us live faithless lives,
- Never taking chances,
- Never trying to change anything,
- Content to simply drift along.

This fear... is actually... A lack of faith...

- In what you are able to achieve with God
- And what God is able to achieve through you

And it shows up as a couple of different ways...

The fear of human opinion *disables*; trusting in God protects you from that. [it "enables"]



Conclusion

Philippians 4:13 says ...
