Acts Intro - Author

Luke:

- He was not one of the Twelve. He was not an eyewitness to the life of Christ (Luke 1:14), but he was a participant in many of the events of Acts.
- The earliest traditions identify the author in Colossians 4:14, "Luke, the beloved physician" and this epistle (Acts), probably aligns with Paul's Roman imprisonment which Luke would have been present according to the "We" sections (Philemon 24; 2 Timothy 4:11).



Acts Intro - Author and Friend

Luke 1:1-3

Many people have set out to write accounts about the events that have been fulfilled among us. ² They used the eyewitness reports circulating among us from the early disciples. ³ Having carefully investigated everything from the beginning, *I also have decided* to write an accurate account for you, most honorable Theophilus,

⁴ so you can be certain of the truth of everything you were taught.



Acts Intro - Theophilus?

Acts 1:1-2

In my first book I told you, Theophilus, about everything Jesus began to do and teach ² until the day he was taken up to heaven after giving his chosen apostles further instructions through the Holy Spirit.
