WHERE IS GOD?

Esther 4

The Book of Esther provides a powerful illustration of God's sovereignty in "working all things together for the good..." (Romans 8:28). Surprisingly, God's name does not appear in Esther. The account leaves "God shaped holes." Nowhere are those holes more evident than in chapter 4; however nowhere is God more needed or more active. Do you ever ask, "Where is God?"

I. Where is God... WHEN WE ARE HURTING? (4:1-2)

- A. Mordecai's Lament (1-2)
- B. The Jews' Lament (3)
- C. Lament is meant for God's people (Psalm 13... cry to God!)

II. Where Is God... WHEN WE ARE ISOLATED? (4:4-8)

- A. Esther was out of touch with Mordecai (4-5)
- B. Esther was out of touch with the Covenant community (6-8).
- C. The value of spiritual community (Psalm 73:13-17).

III. Where is God... WHEN WE ARE FEARFUL? (4:9-11)

- A. The Danger of the Request (9-11a)
- B. The Difficulty of the Circumstances (11b)

IV. Where is God... WHEN WE NEED PURPSOSE? (4:12-17)

- A. The God-shaped holes in Mordecai's message (12-14)
 - 1. The author doesn't mention God and he wants us to notice that!
 - 2. Fill the hole in your life purpose with God.
- B. Esther's Courageous Resolve (15-17)

V. Where is God?

- A. He is very much at work and keeping His promises to His people.
- B. Remember Gen. 12:1-3 and Romans 8:28.

Where is God in your life... your hurts, your isolation, your fears, your life purpose?

Beware of Psalm 14:1 and our own drift toward practical Atheism!

TO DISCUSS WITH FAMILY OR FRIENDS:

- 1. Do we, like Esther, ever get out of touch with God's people and what steps can we take to get back in touch with Christian community?
- 2. Read Psalm 13. Where does it seem that God is absent in your circumstances and how should you respond?

FOR NEXT TIME—Read Esther 5:1-6:13, Tables are Turned
