Abiding in the True Vine John 15:1-11

As Jesus and his disciples make their way from the Upper Room to the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus teaches vital lessons about the meaning of true discipleship. According to Jesus, true disciples will abide in Christ and bear spiritual fruit for the glory of God. To illustrate this truth, Jesus delivers his final "I am" statement in John 15:1 by saying, "I am the true vine". He then calls his disciples to be fruit-bearing branches that abide in Him.

I. True Disciples Must Have Union with Christ (vv.1-6)

- A. False Disciples Are Spiritually Dead
 - They do not bear fruit (v.2)
 - They do not abide in Christ (v.6)
 - They do not inherit eternal life (v.6)

B. True Disciples Are Spiritually Alive

- They are pruned by the Father (v.2)
- They are fruit-bearing branches (vv.2-5)
- They are abiding in and dependent on Christ (vv.4-5)

II. True Disciples Will Bear Spiritual Fruit (vv.7-11)

- **A.** Bible-based Prayers (v.7)
- **B.** God-glorifying Obedience (v.8)
- C. Love-fueled Obedience (v.9-10)
- **D.** Joy-filled Living (v.11)
