Lord, I'm Confused!

Habakkuk 1:1-11

Welcome to "HABAKKUK: THE STRUGGLE." In 1:1, we meet the man and his message. Little known about this prophet; but he is best known by his message—a weighty "burden." He is burdened about what is all around him. We don't face these same circumstances; but we face the same dilemmas in this evil world! With Habakkuk, we ask, "what are the godly to do?"

 - 6. Humanistic (11, worshiped their own power)

III. WE TRUST GOD'S (known) CHARACTER (1:12)

- A. His Attributes (12a, The Eternal One, the Holy One)
- B. His Covenant (12b)
 - 1. Not to Destroy His People
 - 2. But to Chasten His People!

Our world is a mess. Glance at the problems. Gaze at the Lord!

- 2. Read Psalm 13, a prayer of "lament." What does this lament teach us about how to cry out to God?
- 3. Read Habakkuk 1:2-4. Habakkuk, like the psalmists, knew how to lament and take their troubles to God. Which of Habakkuk's complaints can you most relate to in your life or setting?

- c. Complaint to God about Evil (3b-4)
- 4. Read Habakkuk 1:12. What is there about God's character that provides a "rock" on which we can stand in troubled times?
- 5. What will help you take this advice: "Glance at the problems. Gaze at the Lord"?
