Romans 12

•3 For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. 4 For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, 5 so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others.

- We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us.
- If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith;
- 7 if it is serving, then serve;
- · if it is teaching, then teach;
- 8 if it is to encourage, then give encouragement;
- if it is giving, then give generously;
- · if it is to lead, do it diligently;
- if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully.

I Peter 4

- 8 Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins.
- 9 Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling.
- 10 Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.
- 11 If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God.
- If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen.

1 Corinthians 12

•4 There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. ⁵ There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. ⁶ There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work.

• 7 Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. 8 To one there is given through the Spirit a message of wisdom, to another a message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, 9 to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, 10 to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues. 11 All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he distributes them to each one, just as he determines.

The Word of Knowledge—

This gift of the Holy Spirit is having knowledge about something that you have no ability or means of knowing based on your human intelligence.

The Word of Wisdom—This gift of the Holy Spirit works with the word of knowledge. It gives you the ability and understanding of how to apply the word of knowledge or provides good advice to a person or solves a sticky problem. It's wisdom you didn't have before, but God gives it to you.

The Gift of Prophecy—This gift of the Holy Spirit is one that the scripture says, "to especially desire." This gift is a direct Word from the Lord that is to be given to others to edify and build them up or provide confirmation, correction, or direction.

The Gift of Faith—This gift of the Holy
Spirit grows as we walk with the Lord. You
are saved by faith. The gift of faith is
knowing full well that you cannot
accomplish something on your own, but
that Lord has empowered you to move
into new levels to trust Him for the
impossible and to believe for great things.

The Gifts of Healings—There are actually different kinds of healings that the Spirit will do. Notice that the scripture says "gifts," plural. These gifts equip you in various ways to access healing for body, mental and emotional issues, painful memories, and other types of problems that trouble people.

The Working of Miracles—This gift of the Holy Spirit is depicted throughout the Bible, from Moses parting the Red Sea to Jesus feeding 5,000 people. God is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Therefore, He is still in the business of working miracles. This spiritual gift is manifested not by human efforts, but by the Holy Spirit. The work is unexplainable by nature. It edifies and delivers others.

The Discerning of Spirits—This gift of the Holy Spirit equips the discerner to perceive evil spirits that are operating in someone's life. The Holy Spirit pulls back the curtains, exposing the evil spirits so that the person can experience a breakthrough from their bondage.

This gift of the Holy Spirit is the supernatural ability to deliver a message in a language you do not know. This message occurs in an assembly where God anoints another believer with the gift of interpretation, to interpret the word spoken in the native tongue of the congregation (1 Corinthians 14:2, 13-14). Our personal tongues that come with the baptism in the Holy Spirit are for our own edification.

The Interpretation of

Tongues—This gift of the Holy
Spirit is to interpret the message
in tongues that was spoken.
Interpretation of tongues edifies
the church (see 1
Corinthians 14).
