THE SERVICE OF THE WORD

FIRST READING: Hebrews 12:1-7a, 11-13

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

Consider him who endured such hostility against himself from sinners, so that you may not grow weary in your souls or lose heart. In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. And you have forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as children—

"My child, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord or lose heart when you are punished by him, for the Lord disciplines those whom he loves and chastises every child whom he accepts."

Endure trials for the sake of discipline. Now, discipline always seems painful rather than pleasant at the time, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it. Therefore, lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed.

Here ends the reading. Word of God, word of life. **All:** Thanks be to God.

Psalm 32:1-7 (Read responsively.)

Happy are those whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered.

Happy are those to whom the Lord imputes no iniquity and in whose spirit there is no deceit.

While I kept silent, my body wasted away through my groaning all day long.

For day and night your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was dried up as by the heat of summer.

Then I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not hide my iniquity;

I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord," and you forgave the guilt of my sin.

Therefore let all who are faithful offer prayer to you;

at a time of distress, the rush of mighty waters shall not reach them.

You are a hiding place for me;

you preserve me from trouble; you surround me with glad cries of deliverance.

THE RITE OF HOLY BAPTISM – Olivia Hayward

PRESENTATION

Pastor: God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

[Sponsors and Parents: We present Olivia Hayward for baptism.]

Pastor: Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have your child baptized into Christ?

[Parents: We do.]

Pastor: As you bring your child to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with her among God's faithful people, bring her to the word of God and the holy supper, teach her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in her hands the holy scriptures, and nurture her in faith and prayer, so that your child may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help your child grow in the Christian faith and life?

[Parents: We do.]

Pastor: Sponsors, do you promise to nurture this family in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help them live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

[Sponsors: We do.]

Pastor: People of God, do you promise to support Olivia and pray for her in her new life in Christ?

Congregation: We do.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Pastor: I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church. Do you renounce the devil and all the

forces that defy God?

[Parents and Sponsors: I renounce them.]

Pastor: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

[Parents and Sponsors: I renounce them.]

Pastor: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

[Parents and Sponsors: I renounce them.]

Pastor: Do you believe in God the Father?

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Pastor: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

All: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Pastor: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

All: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise

Pastor: Blessed are you, holy God. You are the creator of the waters of the earth. Your Son Jesus promised to send the Spirit to us that the world may know your peace and truth. Pour out your Holy Spirit and breathe new life into this child who is here baptized. By your Spirit adopt us all as your children, through our Savior Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

All: Amen.

THE BAPTISM

Pastor: Olivia, I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

Pastor: Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your children new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life. Sustain Olivia with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

All: Amen.

Pastor: Olivia, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

All: Amen.

Pastor: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

WELCOME

Pastor: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All: We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.

THE PRAYERS

Pastor: Let us pray for all the saints and those who have asked for our prayers.

We celebrate the new birth you give us through the waters of baptism. We pray this day for all the baptized who have come before us, the saints in light who have lived by your grace. We celebrate the lives of those who by faith display the way, the truth and the life of Christ Jesus. We celebrate the gift of Christ and the Holy Spirit that redeems sinners and declares us saints according to the promises of God.

We lift the names of those who have asked for our prayers, and we name them before you now silently. Be present with those we name and give them your peace. Today we remember those who have joined the Church Triumphant since our last All Saints remembrance. We praise you that, having completed their journey on earth in faith, these saints now rest in the sure confidence of your baptismal promises, having received the full inheritance of the saints in light.






THE LORD'S PRAYER
