an activity that encourages learning through following guidelines and/or working as a group



Before kids arrive, take a few moments to pray for them. Pray for those who might visit your group for the first time. Thank God for surrounding us with others who are also creative. Pray for kids as they begin to discover how their creativity fits with the creativity of their peers. Ask God to help kids learn how they might be able to combine their creativity with their friends' creativity to make an even bigger impact!

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1. EARLY ARRIVER IDEA

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container, dice

WHAT YOU DO:

- Guide kids to place their offerings in the container.
- At your signal, guide kids to roll the dice.
- For the first round, challenge them to roll until they get a "straight" with a 1, 2, 3, and 4.
- For the second round, challenge them to get all fours.
- If you don't have a set of dice for each kid, have kids take turns.

2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Hula hoops, upbeat music

WHAT YOU DO:

- Scatter the hoops around your environment.

- When you stop the music, call out a number from two to four.
- Guide kids to get into groups of that number and stand inside a hoop with their group.
- End by calling a group of five. (If you have four kids, join their group. If you have three kids, call a group of four and join them.)

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Great job working together and helping each other! **[Transition]** In Large Group, we'll hear about four friends who helped another friend in a very special way. Let's go learn more."

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BASIC TRUTH

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1. TOGETHER

[TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

AUGUST 2020

WHAT YOU NEED: Bible marked at Mark 2, hand towels, balls, baskets or boxes

WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite a volunteer to open the Bible to Mark 2.
- Ask guiding questions to briefly review the Bible story.
- Be sure to touch on the following points:
- Jesus was teaching at a house in a city. So many people came to hear Him that there wasn't any room—not even outside the door!
- Four men came, carrying a man who couldn't walk. They couldn't get close to Jesus because of the crowd. So, they made a hole in the roof of the house and lowered the man on a mat, through the hole.
- Jesus saw their faith and told the man that his sins were forgiven. He told the man to get up, take his mat, and go home!
- The four men worked together to get their friend to Jesus, and Jesus showed how powerful He was by forgiving his sins and healing him!
- Help kids get into groups of four.
- Give each group a ball and a towel.
- Guide the teams to work together to use the towel to carry the ball to the basket or box, gently lower the ball into the basket, then go back to start.
- The catch: they can't touch the ball with their hands!
- If your environment allows, create an obstacle course.
- Lead the teams to maneuver the course as they move the ball to the basket.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"You guys did a great job working together to get those balls into the basket. Do you think it was hard or easy for the four friends to get their friend to Jesus? (*Pause.*) Why? (*Pause.*) Just like the four men worked together to get their friend to Jesus, you worked together to get the balls to the basket! **God created you to work with others.**

[Make it Personal] (Tell kids a way that you've worked with others, especially if it showed others more about God.)

"What are some ways that you can work with others? (Me and my friends can help cheer up a friend who's sad. I can help my brother or sister clean their room. I can help my mom bake cookies for our neighbor. Me and my friends can help clean the classroom at school.) Great ideas! Just like the four men worked together to help their friend, you can work with your friends to help others, too. So, remember, **God created you to work with others.**"

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*2. HOLE IN THE ROOF

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: "Hole in the Roof" Activity Page, straws, tape

WHAT YOU DO:

- Help kids get into groups of four. If you played the "Together" activity, kids can stay in their same groups.
- Use the masking tape to divide your group's area into two halves.
- Give each kid a straw.
- Place a set of "Hole in the Roof" puzzle pieces face down near each team, making sure all teams are on the same side of the tape line.
- When you say, "Go," teams will race to get all the puzzle pieces to the other side of the line.
- Kids can only pick up the pieces by putting one end of the straw in their mouth and the other end against a puzzle piece then sucking in on the straw.
- They cannot touch the pieces with their hands.
- If kids drop a piece, they must pick it back up with the straw.
- When a team successfully moves all of its pieces, lead them to work together to assemble the puzzle.
- When every team finishes, lead kids to point to the words as you read the verse aloud.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"One way that God is great is that He created us to work together. On our own we can do good things, but when we work with others, we can do even greater things! What are some ways that you can work with others to show people how great God is? (*Me and my friend can make a card to give to our friend. Me and my friends can invite the new kid to play with us. Me and my friends can do a play about Jesus.*) Those are wonderful and creative ideas! So, this week, look for ways to work with others to show people that God is great! And remember, **God created you to work with others."**

3. BETTER . . . TOGETHER [LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

Option 1: Concentration

WHAT YOU NEED: "Better . . . Together Cards" Activity Pages

WHAT YOU DO:

- Help kids get into groups of two.
- Give each pair a set of "Better . . . Together Cards".
- Instruct kids to spread out the cards face down (no peeking).
- Lead kids to take turns turning over two cards and searching for two items that go together (peanut butter and jelly; hammer and nail, etc.).
- If the items go together, the player keeps the pair and play moves to the next kid.
- If the items don't go together, the player turns the cards back over and play moves to the next kid.
- Repeat the game if time allows.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Peanut butter is good on its own. Jelly is good on its own. But when you put them together, they become something more! It's the same with us. On our own, we can show others who God is and what He's like, but when we work with others, we can show people even more who God is.

"Let's say you're good at drawing and your friend is good at writing. If someone is sick or sad, you and your friend can work together to make a card for them. Or let's say there's a new kid at school. You and your friends can ALL play with them so that they feel welcome and accepted. Or let's say that someone falls on the playground and gets hurt. Maybe your friend can stay with them while you run to get an adult.

"Just like the four friends in today's Bible story, **God created you to work with others.** So, this week, look for ways you can work with others to show people who God is and what He's like. Because **God created you to work with others.**"

Option 2: Little Chefs**

WHAT YOU NEED: "Mix Together" Activity Page, trail mix ingredients, measuring cups, large mixing bowl, sealable snack bags

** Allergy Alert: Make parents aware of the ingredients you use today, and consider alternatives for kids with allergies.

WHAT YOU DO:

• Instruct kids to wash their hands.

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(3. BETTER . . . TOGETHER, CONTINUED)

- Use the "Mix Together" Activity Page as a guide to help kids make the snack mix.
- Involve kids as much as possible by inviting some kids to measure, others to pour, and everyone to take turns mixing.
- As kids work, compliment them for working together.
- Help kids divide the snack into the snack bags.
- Encourage them to take the snack home and share it with others.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Each ingredient in our recipe is good on its own, but when you put them all together, they become a really yummy snack! It's like our Bible story today. On their own, each of the four men could have told their friend who couldn't walk about Jesus. TOGETHER, they were able to take him to Jesus then Jesus healed him and forgave him!

"It's the same with us. On our own, we can show others who God is and what He's like; but when we work with others, we can show people even MORE of who God is.

"Let's say you're good at drawing, and your friend is good at writing. If someone is sick or sad, you and your friend can work together to make them a card. Or, if there's a new kid at school, you and your friends can ALL play with them so that they feel welcome and accepted. Maybe, someone falls on the playground and gets hurt. Your friend can stay with them, while you run to get an adult. Just like the four friends in today's Bible story, **God created you to work with others.** So, this week, look for ways to work with others to show people who God is and what He's like; because **God created you to work with others.**"







WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container and beach balls

WHAT YOU DO:

- Challenge kids, one at a time, to keep two beach balls in the air.
- After several kids have tried, encourage them to think of ways they can keep both beach balls in the air.
- Ask: If you work together, how many beach balls do you think you could keep in the air?
- Allow time for them to work together and keep as many beach balls as they can in the air at one time.

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2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Hula hoops, masking tape, mobile device or timer

WHAT YOU DO:

- Divide group into two teams.
- Create a masking tape starting line at one end of your environment, with the opposite wall as the finish line, if
- possible. If not possible, then make a finish line with tape.
- Give each kid a hula hoop.
- Instruct teams to create a "caterpillar" shape by placing one hoop at the starting line and the remaining hoops in a line behind the first hoop.
- Each kid stands in one hula hoop with one empty hoop at the head of the caterpillar line.
- Teams will work together to inch their caterpillar to the finish line.
 - The first kid steps into the empty hoop at the front. Each kid moves up one hula hoop.
 - The kid at the back of the caterpillar then passes their empty hoop overhead to the front of the line.
 - The kid in the front of the caterpillar places the new hoop down in front and steps into the empty hoop.
 - Then everyone moves forward one hoop.
 - Kids continue to pass the last hula hoop to the front and inch their caterpillar toward the finish line.
 - The first caterpillar to touch the finish line, wins.
- Note: If there are not enough hula hoops, teams take turns inching their caterpillar from the start line to the finish line. Time them to see how long it takes each team to reach the finish line.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"You had to really work together to move your caterpillar across the floor. [Transition] Let's head to Large Group to hear what teamwork has to do with creativity."

Lead your group to the Large Group area.

* 1. HELP!

[TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

AUGUST 2020

WHAT YOU NEED: Oven mitts or alternative; collection of various objects to use with the oven mitts

WHAT YOU DO:

- Gather kids in a circle.
- Set the objects in the center of the circle.
- Give each kid a pair of oven mitts. If necessary, kids can take turns.
- Challenge kids to do tasks while wearing the mitts on their hands. Tasks can include:
 - Looking up the memory verse, Psalm 145:3
 - Cutting a circle out of paper
 - Removing a cap from a marker and writing their name
 - Picking up a piece of cardstock from a flat surface
 - Unwrapping a piece of hard candy
 - Spinning a penny on a hard surface
- While kids are doing the tasks, review the Bible story with them. Add to the following discussion based on your kids' responses to the story.
 - When the friends arrived where Jesus was speaking, why couldn't they see Jesus?
 - How did they work together to creatively solve the problem?
 - What could have happened if the four friends didn't work together?
 - How did Jesus heal the paralyzed man? (Besides allowing the man to walk again, talk about how Jesus healed him by forgiving his sins.)

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Imagine what it would have been like to be the paralyzed man in the story. Using scissors or flipping through a book are typically simple tasks, but for the paralyzed man, even the simplest task was difficult and often impossible. There is no way he could have seen Jesus without his friends. Remember, **God created you to work with others.** Just like the four friends in our story, you can do so much more with others than you could alone. We are made in the image of God, and each of us reflects just a little bit of God to the world around us. When we decide to work with others, we reflect even more of who God is to the world."

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2. HOUSE THIS?

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "House" Activity Page, toothpicks, Play-Doh[®]

WHAT YOU DO:

- Gather kids together.
- Place the toothpicks and the Play-Doh in front of the kids.
- Tell kids to pick either several toothpicks or a small ball of Play-Doh.
- Show kids the "House" Activity Page.
- Challenge kids to build a house similar to the one in the picture using the supplies they selected.
- Allow kids to discover that they need to work together in order to successfully build a house resembling the one in the picture.
 - If kids comment on how it's impossible to build a house and they need more supplies, encourage them to be creative.
 - If they still struggle, remind them of the four friends in the story today. Ask what they did.
- Once kids determine they need to work together, give them time to be creative and build a few houses together.
 - While kids work together, consider asking:
 - Can you think of things that are more fun to do with someone else rather than alone?
 - What are some things you can't do by yourself?
 - Can you think of a time when you worked with others to help someone? (My family made dinner for a friend. We raked our neighbor's lawn. My school raised money to buy books for the library.)

WHAT YOU SAY:

"When you combined your supplies and worked together, you were able to build some very creative houses. **God created you to work with others,** and when we combine our resources and our creativity, we can do more TOGETHER than we could alone. What if you got hurt on the playground? It would be great to have a group of your friends work together to help you. One friend could stay with you while another friend got the teacher. What about cleaning up the classroom after a big art project? If you had to do it by yourself, it would take a long time. If the whole class worked together, you could get the job done so much quicker."

[Make it Personal] (Share a time a group of your friends worked together to help someone. Maybe a group of you helped your friend paint their house, or you worked at a day camp with a group of volunteers, or participated in a fundraiser for a local charity.)

3. FLYING MAT

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Memory Verse Cards" Activity Pages, Bibles, masking tape, and "mats"

WHAT YOU DO:

- Give each kid a Bible and look up Psalm 145:3. See tips for looking up verses with 2nd and 3rd graders in Week One.
- Read the verse together.
- Create a starting line with masking tape.
- Divide the group into two teams and give each kid a "mat."
- Place a set of "Memory Verse Cards" across the room (or about 20 feet away) from each team. Place an empty mat in front of each team at the starting line.
- Line teams up, holding their mats behind the starting line.
- Teams will get to the verse cards by creating a line of mats to reach them.
- The first kid sits on the mat at the starting line then places his mat beside it.
- The first kid then scoots to the front mat so the second kid can sit on the empty mat. The second kid then passes his mat to the front where the first kid sets it down and scoots to it. The second kid scoots to the empty mat and leaves his open for player three.
- Player three sits on the empty mat and passes her mat to the front.
- All kids scoot up one spot.
- Teams continue in this way until their line of mats reaches the verse cards.
- Then, kids pass the verse cards back to the starting line, one card at a time.
- The first team to get all of their cards back to the starting line and in verse order, wins!

WHAT YOU SAY:

"You did a great job working together! Imagine if you had to do this race while sitting on just one mat by yourself! How hard would that be? **God created you to work with others.** Working together reflects to the world how great God is, and often, like in our game, working together is a lot of fun."

WHAT YOU NEED: No supplies needed

WHAT YOU DO:

- Gather kids in a circle.
- Prompt kids to think about your time together today.
- Ask: Who worked together to help us learn about this

story and what it means for us? Be prepared to prompt kids. How did we hear the Bible story? What about the supplies needed for our activities? Who provided music for us during worship? Be sure to include the people who worked together behind the scenes, e.g. the team that cleans the environment, the decorating team, people who give money to the church for the program, etc.

• Close in prayer, thanking God for all the people who work together at your church.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"God, You are great! There is no limit to Your creativity! You made us in Your image to reflect You and Your creativity to the people around us. Just like the four friends in our story today, we can do so much more together than we could do by ourselves. God, You created us to work with others. Our church is a great example of what we can do when we work with others. Thank You, God, for all the people who worked together to help us learn about You! In Your name, Amen."

As adults arrive to pick up, encourage kids to tell their parents about the creativity of four friends who worked together to help their friend get healed.

SOCIAL: PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION (15 MINUTES)

Welcome kids and spend time engaging in conversation and catching up. Get ready to experience today's story. **(Choose one or both of these activities.)**



1. JUST FOR FUN

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container, bottles, clothespins, crayons, pennies, paper clips, small candy

WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite kids to place their offerings in the container.
- **Create** five stations by setting the bottles/jars in different areas of the room.
 - Near each bottle, place one type of item that will be used for dropping into the bottle.
- Ask kids to pair up and go to one of the stations.
- **Explain** that they will take 30-second turns with their partner to see how • many items they can drop in the bottle.
 - The rules are the same for each station: Hold the object with a straight arm at shoulder height and stand straight, not bending over.
- Switch stations after both partners have had a 30-second turn, repeating until all the kids have rotated through each station.
- If you have extra time, let those with the highest scores from each station compete with one another.

2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: No supplies needed

WHAT YOU DO:

- Sit in a circle.
- **Challenge** kids to go around the circle and name the people who made it possible for them to have breakfast
- that day, without repeating any of the previous people mentioned.
- Their answers might include such people as their mom, dad, relative, a dairy farmer, grocery store checkout person, doughnut shop baker, and so on.
- **Continue** until someone is unable to come up with a unique answer within five seconds.
- **Repeat** with other areas of life in which we rely on others.
- Kids can make suggestions or use ideas from the list below:
 - Who made it possible for you to . . .
 - watch a YouTube demonstration of how to decorate a cake
 - wear the shoes you have on
 - turn on a light
 - text a friend
 - eat a pizza

WHAT YOU SAY:

"It's crazy how many people are involved in making it possible for us to do something as simple as eating breakfast. Imagine what it would be like if any one of those people you mentioned decided they weren't going to do their job or work together. We'd all be sitting here very hungry! [Transition] In Large Group, we're going to hear about some friends who solved a problem by working together for the benefit of someone else. It took some work, but in the end, it was so worth the effort."

1. TAKE A SNAPSHOT

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "TIC-TAC-TOEgether" Activity Page, pens

WHAT YOU DO:

- **Give** each of the kids a pen and a set of the nine "Tic-Tac-TOEgether" cards.
- **Ask** them to write their name and a skill they have or something they like to do on the blank card. This will become a FREE spot when placed among their other cards.
- **Hold up** one of the "TIC-TAC-TOEgether" cards and direct kids to turn that card over on their grid.
- **Continue** until one or more kids have turned over three cards in a row or a diagonal (like a Tic-Tac-Toe win).
- **Ask** the winner to read the three cards that were in a row and come up with a situation in which the three kids described on the cards could join their skills and work together to solve a problem, complete a project, or help someone in some way.
 - Ask them, "How can this team of three combine their 'super powers' (talents) for good?"
 - If they need help thinking of ideas, the winner can enlist the help of another group member, or you could give them a hypothetical situation and let them think of a solution.
- **Instruct** kids to rearrange their cards and play again.
 - Each round should bring a new combination of skills.
 - **Challenge** them to come up with new ideas with each combination of cards.

WRAP UP AND SAY:

"God made us so that we're 'better together.' Sure, you can be creative on your own, but you can do so much more when you use your special gifts together with others. You have unique abilities and perspective that you bring into the mix. When you combine your great ideas, creativity, and efforts with others, it's like having super-powers! You won't be able to leap from a roof and fly, but like the men in today's story, your creative power will help you figure out a better way to get off of a roof!"

2. BIBLE STORY EXTENSION [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW] WHAT YOU NEED: Bible

WHAT YOU DO:

- **Sit** in a circle.
- **Explain** that the group will work together to create a detailed picture in their minds of the people and places in today's Bible
- **Begin** reading Mark 2:1-2, then pause and tell kids to close their eyes.
- **Ask** them to picture the scene you just read and each take a turn adding a detail describing what they see in their "mind's eyes."
 - The objective is not to change the story but to help it come to life with descriptions of the surroundings such as the colors of buildings, clothing, the sounds, smells, looks on people's faces, and whatever they think they might have seen if they had been there at the time the story took place.
 - Make the scene come to life with details, but make sure kids don't take it too far and alter the true account of the story.
- **Continue** reading Mark 2:3-5, then pause again to let kids close their eyes and add more imagery to the scene.
- **Repeat** again after reading Mark 2:6-8, then once more at the end, Mark 2: 9-12.
- **Give** kids an opportunity to discuss how their original mental picture changed as the group added more details.
- Ask:
 - In what way did the story come to life a bit more when everyone worked together to paint a picture of the people, sounds, and sights?
 - What can you learn about working together from the four friends of the man who couldn't walk?
 - What are some modern-day situations in which people have worked together to accomplish something they couldn't do as well on their own?

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4. VERSE TO TAKE WITH YOU

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: Bible, foil

WHAT YOU DO:

- **Instruct** kids to pair themselves up.
- Give partners a long piece of aluminum foil (at least

10 feet).

- **Direct** them to work together to create a scrunched foil statue of two friends.
 - The statues must be freestanding and pairs must use all of the foil.
 - Circle kids up when they finish and let partners show one another their statues.
- Invite someone to read Ecclesiastes 4:9.

• Ask:

- What are things we do that are better when done with the help of someone else?
- How can working with others make you more creative?
- Describe someone (no names) you would enjoy working with and why.
 How can you be the kind of person others want to work together with?
- **Challenge** kids to do something this week that requires them to work with one or two other people.
 - Suggest that they plan a meal or family outing that costs only five dollars, record a funny video to send to someone who needs a good laugh, clean something, teach someone how to do something new, or other ideas they come up with that uses their talent combined with the skills of someone else.
 - Ask for a couple volunteers to share some ideas of what they could do this week to creatively work with others.


