PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION
15 MINUTES

MADE TO PLAY

an activity that encourages learning through following guidelines and/or working as a group



Before kids arrive, take a few moments to pray for them. Start by thanking God for being a God who keeps His promises. Think of a couple of promises you're especially grateful for and praise God for those specific promises. Especially at the end of such a difficult year, thank God for the ways you've seen Him work and felt His presence.

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1. EARLY ARRIVER

WHAT YOU NEED: "Christmas Song Fill-In" Activity Pages, offering container, pen

WHAT YOU DO:

- Welcome kids by name as they arrive. Encourage kids who brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
- Call on kids to give you answers to fill in the blanks on the "Christmas Song Fill-In" Activity Pages. (Make sure not to reveal the lyrics or let anyone see the page before you finish filling in the blanks.)
- After you fill in the blanks for each song, place the page in the center of the circle and sing them together with your new, silly lyrics.
- Repeat for the rest of the songs as time allows.

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2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Cornstarch, lotion, body wash or hair conditioner, large mixing bowl, small paper plates, and *(optional)* zip-top bags

NOTE: If you choose not to make dough, you can offer balls of Play-Doh® instead. Keep in mind that some kids

have an allergy to the ingredients used and/or Play-Doh.

WHAT YOU DO:

- Mix the cornstarch and lotion (or body wash/conditioner) together in a large mixing bowl.
- If you think kids can handle it with self-control, let them take turns helping to mix.
- Once the mixture is firm and has the consistency of modeling dough, give each kid a small paper plate and ball of dough.
- Instruct the kids to shape the dough into something that represents what they love MOST about Christmas.
- If desired, allow the kids to take their dough home in a zip-top bag.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Wow! There are lots and lots of things to love about Christmas. You might hope for some or ALL of these things this Christmas season. [Transition] Today, we'll hear about something people had been hoping for—for hundreds of years! It's what Christmas is all about."

Lead your group to the Large Group area.

MADE TO IMAGINE

an activity that promotes empathy and facilitates concrete application through role-play and reenactment

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*1. A SON IS GIVEN [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Isaiah 9:6" Activity Page, Bibles marked at Isaiah 9:6, silver or gold pipe cleaners, small star cookie cutters, cardstock, scissors, a single hole punch, and yarn or string

WHAT YOU DO:

- Pass out the Bibles to every two or three kids.
- Encourage the kids to open the Bibles to Isaiah 9:6 and read it aloud together.
- Discuss the following questions:
 - God promised to send someone to rescue His people (the Israelites) forever. Who was it? (Jesus)
 - Isaiah, a prophet who spoke for God, spoke these words hundreds of years before Jesus was born. Did Jesus come? (Yes! That's why we celebrate Jesus' birth at Christmas.)
 - How does Jesus' birth show that God keeps His promises? (Because Jesus WAS born, just as God promised. That's why we can have hope because God keeps His promises.)
- Pass out a pipe cleaner to each kid.
- Encourage them to use the cookie cutter as a guide to press the pipe cleaner along the outside edge to create a star shape. NOTE: They will need to share the cookie cutters. Make sure everyone has clean/sanitized hands as they pass around the cookie cutters.
- Help each kid twist the two ends of the pipe cleaner together then remove the cookie cutter to reveal the star shape.
- Give each child an "Isaiah 9:6" cut out.
- Punch a hole in the top of the cut-out verse.
- Run the yarn through the hole then attach it as the hanger for the star.
- Have kids write their names and "2020" on the back of the verse card. Set aside ornaments for pick-up.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"God promised His people that He would send a Savior! Isaiah spoke these words on your ornaments hundreds of years before Jesus came! Jesus' birth is proof that God loves us. And it's why we can have hope because God keeps His promises. When you place this on your Christmas tree at home, remember that God is a promise maker AND a promise keeper. He always does what He says He will do, and that means we can trust God, always."

[Make it Personal] (Tell your few why this promise in Isaiah is important to you. Talk about the first time you remember reading this promise and understanding that it was made hundreds of years before it came true. How does knowing that God kept that promise in the past help you trust that God will keep His promises in the future, too?)

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2. PROMISES MADE, PROMISES KEPT [LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Scraps of colored paper or colored index cards, markers, glue sticks, and a piece of butcher paper

WHAT YOU DO:

- Pass out a paper scrap or an index card and marker to each kid.
- Encourage the kids to think of a promise someone made to them or to someone else and draw a picture to represent that promise on their paper.
- As kids finish, encourage them to glue their promise pictures to the butcher paper to create a collage.
- Kids may draw on more than one paper scrap or index card to fill up the butcher paper.
- Once you've covered most of the butcher paper, allow the kids to share the promises made to go along with what they've drawn. Discuss whether the promise made was a promise that was kept.
- Grab a marker and write the word "HOPE" in large block letters across the center of the butcher paper. NOTE: If you think your few would be frustrated by covering what they've drawn, write the word "HOPE" at the top or to the side of their drawings.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Sometimes people make promises to us, or we make promises to others like those you drew, but we don't keep them. Maybe a friend or family member promised to (point to and name a promise from the pictures on the butcher paper collage), and they didn't follow through. But God isn't like us. God never breaks a promise. When God says He will do something, He does it. When God says something will happen, it will. The Bible is full of God's promises—promises that He already kept. He kept His promise to send a Savior, and He's STILL keeping promises like His promise to always love us and be with us. We can place all our HOPE and TRUST in God because He is completely trustworthy. We can have hope because God keeps His promises."

3. ROLL IT OUT VERSE

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Bibles and a ball

WHAT YOU DO:

• Pass out a Bible to every two or three kids and help them look up Luke 2:11 using the navigation tips below.

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Finding verses with kindergartners: Guide kids to open the Bibles to the marked page. Point to "Luke" at the top of the page as you say, "Luke." Then, guide kids to find the big number 2 on the page. Explain that this is the chapter number. Finally, guide them to look under the big 2 for the little 11; this is the verse number. Tell them to leave their finger on the verse as you read the verse aloud. Then, lead everyone to say the verse together.

Finding verses with 1st graders: Guide them to open their Bibles to the front and find the table of contents. (Hold up a Bible opened to the table of contents to show the kids what the page looks like. When the kids find the table of contents, lead them to find Luke in the list under "New Testament.") You can help by telling them that Luke starts with the letters L-U. When the kids find Luke, lead them to look at the page number beside the word. Explain that the number tells them on what page they can find Luke. Help the kids find the page. When they find Luke, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Help them find chapter 2. Explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Help them find verse 11 in chapter 2.

- Read the verse aloud as the kids follow along.
- Then, repeat the very first part of the verse: Today in the town of David.
- Spend a moment talking about this part of the verse.
 - The town of David is Bethlehem. This was the same David who killed the giant Goliath and later became king of Israel.
- Direct the kids to sit in circle.
- Guide kids to pass the ball to the left from friend to friend as you repeat the words of the verse.
- Repeat the verse two or three more times, switching the direction of the ball: pass to the right, pass across the circle, pass to every other friend, etc.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"All month long, we're celebrating Jesus, God's greatest gift to us. That's why Christmas is a such a BIG deal! God made a promise to send us a Savior, and He kept that promise! Our verse reminds us that Jesus, our Savior, has been born to us! We can trust God, no matter what, because God does what He says He will do. We can have hope because God keeps His promises."

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4. PRAY AND DISMISS [PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Star ornaments from "A Son Is Given" Activity

WHAT YOU DO:

- Ask the kids to hold their star ornaments and circle up.
- Go around the circle and pray for each kid, placing his/ her name in the blank below.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"God, thank You that (name each kid around your circle) can put their hope in You because You always keep Your promises. Thank You for promising to send a Savior to us and for keeping that promise by sending Your only Son, Jesus. Help us remember this week that we can have hope because God keeps His promises. In Jesus' name we pray, amen."

As adults arrive to pick up, have the kids show off their star ornaments and share how we can have hope because God keeps His promises.







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1. EARLY ARRIVER

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container, Christmas stocking, small Christmas-related items, ribbon to close the stocking, timer, index cards, and pencils

WHAT YOU DO:

- Welcome the kids by name as they arrive and say, "Merry Christmas!"
- Show kids who have brought offerings where to put them in the offering container.
- Invite the kids to sit in a circle.
- Pass out index cards and pencils to each kid.
- Share that you will pass a stocking around the circle that's filled with Christmas-y things.
- The object of the game is for the kids to feel the stocking and to try to guess as many items as they can before the timer goes off.
- Set the timer for 30 seconds and give the stocking to the first kid.
- Instruct the kids to write their guesses on their index card when their time is up.
- When everyone has had a chance to make some guesses, open the stocking and show the kids what the items are.

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2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: No supplies needed

WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite the kids to stand in a circle.
- Explain to the kids that you will start a story, and they help you make it up and tell it.
- You will share one sentence to start the story about a promise.
- The kids will take turns adding sentences to the story.
- The goal is to turn the story into something that ends positively and happily.
- Share the first sentence of a story. Here are some examples:
 - Kiesha's mom promised she would get Kiesha a doll she wanted this Christmas, but she unexpectedly lost her job.
 - Mark's favorite uncle promised that he'd visit this Christmas season, but it's two days before Christmas and Mark's uncle is sick.
 - Danielle's grandma promised that she would make gingerbread houses with Danielle, but all of the stores are out of graham crackers.
- Play as many rounds of the game as time allows.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Great job turning the story around until the promise was fulfilled! Did you know that God always fulfills—or keeps—His promises, too? [Transition] Let's go to Large Group to hear about a very important promise God made a long time ago that came true."

Lead your group to the Large Group area.

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1. ACTION REVIEW [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Review Questions" Activity Page, "Action" Activity Page, gift bag

WHAT YOU DO:

- Instruct the kids to stand in a circle.
- Invite one kid to stand in the center of the circle.
- Have the kid in the center of the circle pull an action card out of the gift bag and read it out loud.
- Explain to the kids that you will ask the kid a question about today's story.
 - If the kid answers the question correctly, everyone in the group has to do the action that the kid pulled out of the bag.
 - If the answer is incorrect, the kid has to do the action alone.
- Continue playing until every kid has had a chance to answer a question.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Do you think it's difficult to trust a person who breaks their promises over and over again? Why? The Israelites broke their promise to love and obey God over and over again. But God still kept His promise to never leave them. He sent good kings and prophets to help them and show them that He was still with them.

"Today you heard how God promised over and over that He would send a Savior to rescue us from our sins. He made lots of different promises about Jesus coming to rescue us years before Jesus was even born. God promised His people that He would send Jesus, and He did! That's because God ALWAYS keeps His promises. Because God has kept His promises in the past, we know that He will keep His promises to us now and in the future. **We can have hope because God keeps His promises.** Now, that's something to celebrate at Christmas!"

*2. PROMISE JUMP [LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Small craft sticks

WHAT YOU DO:

- Gather the kids around you.
- Show the kids two craft sticks.
- Promise the kids that you will place the sticks two feet apart and jump over both sticks with just one jump.
- Ask the group if they think you can keep your promise.
- Jump over the sticks to demonstrate that you kept your promise.
- Move the sticks farther apart, and make the same promise. (Make sure you can jump the distance you moved the sticks so you can keep your promise.)
- Again, ask the kids if they think you can keep your promise.
- Jump over the sticks successfully.
- Next, move the sticks so far apart that it's obvious you can't jump over them in one jump.
- This time, don't promise to jump over the sticks.
- Ask the kids how they'd feel if you promised to jump over the sticks with one jump.
- Attempt to jump over the sticks.
- Give each kid two sticks.
- Instruct them to figure out how far apart they can place their sticks to fulfill a promise to jump over them with one jump.
- Ask the kids to demonstrate their jumps.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Good job figuring out how far you could jump to keep your promise. When my sticks were close together, was it easy for you to trust that I would keep my promise? How would you have felt if I had promised to jump over the sticks when they were very far apart? Even if I had made a promise that I could jump over the sticks that were far apart, would you have trusted me to keep my promise?

"It really makes sense to only promise things that you know you can do. And yet, there are times when you and other people you know, might not keep their promises. The good news is that when God makes a promise, He always keeps it. God always does what He says He will do.

"God promised His people over and over that He would send a Savior to rescue them. At Christmas, God sent Jesus. He kept His promise like He always does.

"When you remember that God kept His promise to send Jesus at Christmas, it can help you have hope in any situation. Since God always keeps His promises, that means that He will always keep His promises to you. What has He promised you? He has promised that He will always be with you. He has

promised that He is always working for good, even when things are hard. Because God always keeps His promises, you can have hope that God will keep those promises, too.

"Maybe your family was impacted by COVID-19. That might mean that your Christmas will look different this year. You might not get all the gifts you want, or you might not be able to celebrate Christmas with your family and friends like you have in the past. No matter what happens, it's important to remember that **we can have hope because God keeps His promises.**"

[Make it Personal] (Share with your kids a time when you saw God keep His promise to you when times were hard. What did He do, and were you surprised at how He did it? How did it bring you hope for the future?)

3. FILL-IN BOOKMARKS [HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Bookmark" Activity Page, Bibles, pencils, markers, hole punch, yarn, decorating supplies

WHAT YOU DO:

• Look up this month's memory verse (Luke 2:11) using the navigation tips below.

Finding verses with 2nd and 3rd graders: Guide them to open their Bibles to the front and find the table of contents. (Hold up a Bible opened to the table of contents to show the kids what the page looks like.) When the kids find the table of contents, lead them to find Luke in the list under "New Testament." When the kids find Luke, lead them to look at the page number beside the word. Explain that the number tells them on what page they can find Luke. Help the kids find the page. When they find Luke, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Help them find chapter 2. Explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Help them find verse 11 in chapter 2.

- Find the verse and read it out loud as a group.
- Pass out the bookmarks and pencils, one bookmark and one pencil for each kid.
- Explain to the kids that this month's memory verse is supposed to be written on their bookmarks, but there are words missing.
- Tell them that the missing words are written under each blank line, but the letters are scrambled.
- Instruct the kids to unscramble the letters to figure out the missing words.
- Punch a hole at the top of the bookmarks.
- Pass out a piece of yarn to each kid and demonstrate how to loop it through the hole and tie a knot.
- Set out the markers and decorating supplies.
- Invite kids to decorate their bookmarks.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"This verse is a great reminder that God promised to send the Messiah which means 'Savior.' Many years before Jesus was born, God promised that the Savior He would send would be a relative of King David. This verse is what the angel said when He told the shepherds that Jesus had been born. The angel was telling the shepherds that God had sent a Savior who was a relative of King David. God kept His promise because God always keeps His promises.

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2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Plastic circular ornaments, gift boxes and gift bags, and tape for a starting and finish line

WHAT YOU DO:

- **Make** a starting line on one side of the room using tape and ask everyone to stand behind the line and to spread out as much as they can.
- **Give** each kid a plastic ornament and ask them to place it on the line.
- **Use** tape to mark a finish line on the opposite side of the room.
- Ask everyone to choose a gift box or a gift bag as their fan.
- **Explain** that they will have to fan their ornament down to the finish line.

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1. TAKE A SNAPSHOT [LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Prepared bag full of Christmas objects and a gift box with a lid

WHAT YOU DO:

- Without the kids seeing, **place** one of the Christmas items from the bag into the box.
- **Pick** one person to come up and peek in the box to see the object.
- That kid then has to describe the object to the group while they all try to guess what it is.
- The first kid to guess correctly gets to come up and describe the next item.
- Repeat until all the items have been described.
- **Ask:** When someone describes something BUT you can't see it, can you know for sure what it's going to be?

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2. BIBLE STORY EXTENSION [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: Seven pieces of plexiglass or plastic or laminating sheets (around 8x10 size), dry erase or wet erase markers, Bibles, cards from "Bible Story Notecards" Activity Page

WHAT YOU DO:

- **Divide** the group into pairs and **give** each pair a notecard, a marker, and a piece of clear plastic/plexiglass/laminating sheet.
- If you have more notecards than pairs, **ask** for some pairs to volunteer to take two notecards.
- Ask someone to look up Isaiah 9:6 and read it aloud to the group
- **Explain** that each group needs to illustrate some kind of representation of their part of the verse (the words on their notecard).
- They can interpret the verse literally or draw something abstract to represent the concepts in their verse phrase.
- When everyone is finished, let each pair explain their drawings.
- Then **collect** all seven drawings and stack them on top of each other.
- **Hold** up the stack so everyone can see the drawings layered together.
- **Say:** Everything you see here is what was promised in the person of Jesus. AND all the promises came true!
- Ask:
 - After hearing this verse, what do you think the people in the Old Testament expected Jesus to be like?

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4. VERSE TO TAKE WITH YOU [HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: White butcher paper, green paint, large paint brushes, black paint or markers, Bibles, scissors, tape

WHAT YOU DO:

• **Pass** out the Bibles and **ask** everyone to look up this month's memory verse, Luke 2:11.

Finding verses with 4th-5th graders: Our verse is from Luke. Ask kids to tell you whether that's in the Old Testament or the New Testament. (New) So we know it's toward the back of the Bible. It's the third of the four gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John). When they find Luke, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Tell them to find chapter 2. Explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Tell them to them find verses 11in chapter 2.

- **Ask:** What is the main point of the verse? Why is it important? How does this verse show us that God kept His promises from Isaiah 9:6?
- **Show** everyone the art supplies and explain that they need to work together to paint a big Christmas tree, cut it out, and hang it on the wall.
- Today's memory verse should to be painted or drawn into the tree.
 - They can do this over top of the green or incorporate it into the tree itself.
 - But when you look at the tree, you should be able to read the full verse.
- **Explain** that they will spend the month decorating this tree with God's promises.

5. MAKE IT PERSONAL WITH PRAYER [PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Plastic circular ornaments (from Opening Activity), black permanent marker

WHAT YOU DO:

• As a group, **review** the words from Isaiah 9:6 that describe God's promised Savior:

- Wonderful Counselor
- Mighty God
- Everlasting Father
- Prince of Peace
- **Ask** everyone to pick up an ornament and a sharpie and write one of the descriptions on their ornament.
- Place all the ornaments in the center of the group and mix them up.
- **Spend** a few minutes praying together as a group by praising God for keeping His promises.
 - One kid at a time picks up an ornament and thanks God for what they see on the ornament.
 - For example, thank You, God, for sending Jesus to be our Wonderful Counselor; thank You for the hope we have in our Mighty God; we praise You for sending us the Prince of Peace; thank You God for keeping Your promises, thank You God for the hope we have through the Everlasting Father, etc.
- Finish by closing the group in prayer.
- Let kids each take an ornament home with them as a reminder that we worship a God who keeps His promises and we can have hope in that this Christmas season.
