

Atonement Theory	Core Idea	Biblical Support	Strengths	Challenges
Christus Victor	Jesus defeats sin, death, and the powers of evil.	Colossians 2:15; 1 Corinthians 15:54-57; Hebrews 2:14	Emphasizes liberation and God's triumph over evil.	Can underplay personal sin and the need for repentance.
Ransom Theory	Jesus' death is a ransom paid to free humanity from bondage.	Mark 10:45; 1 Timothy 2:6	Strong image of rescue and freedom.	Raises questions about to whom the ransom is paid-God or Satan?
Moral Influence	Jesus' death reveals God's love, inspiring us to live differently.	John 3:16; Romans 5:8	Focuses on transformation through love and example.	May minimize sin's weight or the need for divine justice.
Penal Substitution	Jesus takes on the punishment we deserve, satisfying divine justice.	Isaiah 53; Romans 3:25- 26; 2 Corinthians 5:21	Highlights the seriousness of sin and God's justice.	Can portray God as wrathful or overly legalistic.
