- 1. Read 1 Samuel 16:1-7. What happens in this story?

- 3. When we sin, what does it do to God, to us, and to others?
- 4. God told Samuel to fill his "horn with oil" and to go anoint the new king. How do you think knowing God had a plan encouraged Samuel? How does this encourage you?
- 5. Read 1 Samuel 16:7. How does man see people? How does God see people? What should we be most concerned with: outward appearance or the heart? Why?
- 6. Years later, the Messiah King (Jesus) would come from Bethlehem. Read Isaiah 53:1-6. How does this describe Jesus in his first coming? Read Philippians 2:9-11. How does this describe Jesus when he comes again?
