## REVIEW

In 1 Samuel 13, we learned of "Saul's Folly," when Saul and his army were facing the Philistines. Instead of waiting on the Lord and the priest, Samuel, Saul decided to offer the burnt offering himself. Saul disobeyed the Lord, and Samuel prophesied that the Kingdom would be taken from Saul and given to another.

## LIES THAT DESTROY

- God commanded Saul to destroy the A\_\_\_\_\_ and all they owned. Saul disobeyed, believing three lies that would destroy him:
  - Lie #1 - Partial obedience is O\_\_\_\_\_
  - Lie #2 - My good W\_\_\_\_\_ are good enough
  - Lie #3 - I can J\_\_\_\_\_ myself
- God didn't want the treasures of war. He wanted Saul's HEART. He wanted obedience.

1. Read 1 Samuel 15:10-23

3. What is sin? *Sin is disobedience against God's perfect law, by failing to do what God commands or doing what God forbids.*
4. According to Romans 3:23, who is guilty of sin? *We are.*
5. Read Psalm 89:30-32. What does every sin deserve? *The wrath and curse of God.*
6. According to 1 Timothy 1:15, why did Jesus come into this world? *To save sinners.*
7. Read Isaiah 55:7. How can we be saved? *Repentance and faith.*
8. Read Ephesians 2:8-9. Can anyone be saved by his own works? *No one can be saved by his own works - we have been saved by God's grace (undeserved kindness) by faith in Christ.*

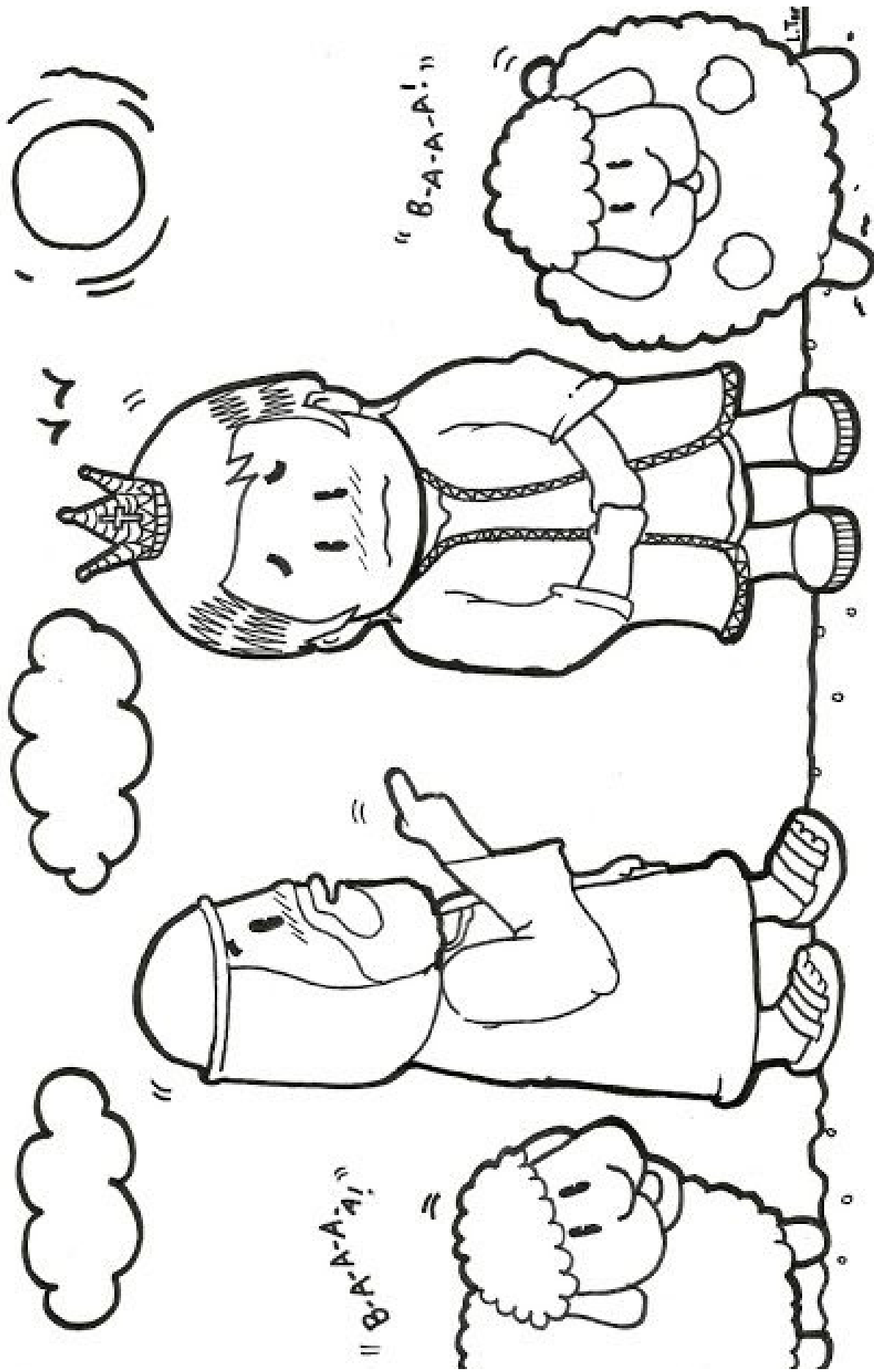
Jesus, eternal God,
