Elijah said to Elisha, “Stay here; the Lord has sent me to Bethel.” But Elisha said, “As surely as the Lord lives and as you live, **I will not leave you.**” So they went down to Bethel. The company of the prophets at Bethel came out to Elisha and asked, “**Do you know that the Lord is going to take your master from you today?**” ... When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, “Tell me, what can I do for you before I am taken from you?” “**Let me inherit a double portion of your spirit,**” Elisha replied. “You have asked a difficult thing,” Elijah said, “yet if you see me when I am taken from you, it will be yours—otherwise, it will not.” As they were walking along and talking together, suddenly a chariot of fire and horses of fire appeared and separated the two of them, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind. Elisha saw this and cried out, “**My father! My father! The chariots and horsemen of Israel!**” And Elisha saw him no more.
