



Lesson 41: God Does Not Forsake His Unfaithful People (Judges 6)

Big Idea: God is faithful and disciplines His children to bring them to repentance.

From the story we learned about the rising unfaithfulness in Israel. We got introduced to Gideon and how God chooses the weak to fulfill his purposes.

Please help your child to memorize the verse and the Scripture reference. Please review with them the place of the book of Judges in the Bible.

Scripture Memory Verse:

2 Chronicles 16:9 - For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to give strong support to those whose heart is blameless toward him.

Discussion Questions:

1. Have each students repeat one thing this story told us about God. "God is holy and does not ignore sin. He disciplines those He loves to cause them to repent. He is faithful to keep His promises. He is merciful, faithful, and attentive to the cries of His people. He will never forsake his people."
2. Why would God choose the least in the weakest clan? What does this tell you about what is needed to fight hard battles? Why was it important for Gideon to destroy the altar of Baal and the Asherah pole?
