SUMMIT

DANIEL 9:1-23

MAIN IDEA:

A Gospel Prayer begins with God, acknowledges our sin, pleads for mercy, and delights in God's response.

IT BEGINS WITH GOD DANIEL 9:1-4

- Prayer is a response to God and His Word
- Prayer is to the God revealed in the Word great and awesome

IT PLEADS FOR MERCY DANIEL 9:15-19

- Daniel does not ask based on his righteousness and resume
- Daniel pleads for mercy

IT ACKNOWLEDGES OUR SIN

DANIEL 9:5-14

- True repentance does not deflect responsibility
- True repentance does not try to save face

IT DELIGHTS IN GOD'S RESPONSE

DANIEL 9:20-23

- God ordains prayer to be the means by which he works
- God responds to the prayer of his covenant people with love

True "gospel prayer," as exemplified by Daniel in Daniel Chapter 9, is not a self-centered wish list but a deeply theological and humble response to God. It is characterized by beginning with God's revelation, acknowledging one's sinfulness, pleading for God's mercy based on His character (not human merit), and delighting in His sovereign, loving response.
