#### **OUR STORY**

New Life began in 1978 by three men, all in their early 20s, Bob Pannecouk, Tony Mancina, and Steve Upshur. Each of them experienced the radical transformation of the Gospel in their late teens through a sovereign move of God called the Jesus Movement. Overwhelmed and overjoyed with the love of God they began to reach out to their communities. None of them set out to be pastors, but as they shared Christ with their city, people responded to the message and a church was born. A unique church with three senior pastors bringing their diversity of backgrounds, giftings, and callings to serve and lead the congregation of New Life.



In spite of their personal diversity there was a tremendous spiritual unity in Christ, which propelled the church forward. From the beginning, New Life was fueled by prayer, led by the Spirit, and driven to reach the lost. As people began to respond to Jesus, the church experienced exponential growth. In 1979, the church purchased Avon Elementary in St. Clair Shores, Michigan (its current location) and in 1987 the church added a large addition, which is our current main sanctuary. With a desire to reach people through any means necessary, New Life hosted a radio show, produced a television program, started Zoe Christian Academy (now Parkway Christian). They also began developing relationships with several international ministries and missions.

In 1996, after serving together for over 15 years, the pastors sensed God leading them to expand their reach and ministries. Pastor Steve began Peacemakers International in Detroit, Pastor Tony planted Salt River Church in New Baltimore, and Pastor Bob remained the lead pastor of New Life.

Between 2001-2004, New Life built a recording studio, opened Wee Love Day Care, and started Champions for Life Kids' Camp designed for foster children. After over 40 years in ministry, Pastor Bob transitioned leadership of New Life to Mike Molloy and Tommy Sheerer who are carrying on New Life's unique legacy through their joint leadership of the church. At its core, the church is moving into the future with the same DNA of its past. A diverse leadership held by unity in Christ, with a passion to be a church filled with people who Love God, Love People, and Live on Mission.

#### SPIRITUAL GIFTS ARE NOT

#### 1. Natural Aptitudes, Strengths, or Abilities.

#### 2. Character Traits

#### 3. Titles or Positions

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# GIFT DEFINITIONS AND SCRIPTURE REFERENCES

The following contains definitions of the Spiritual Gifts. While not meant to be complete or final, these definitions correspond to the gifts as expressed in the Spiritual Gifts Assessment.

ADMINISTRATION: The gift of administration is the divine strength or ability to organize multiple tasks and groups of people to accomplish these tasks. Luke 14:28-30; Acts 6:1-7; 1 Corinthians 12:28

**APOSTLESHIP:** The gift of apostleship is the divine strength or ability to pioneer new churches and ministries through planting, overseeing, and training. Acts 15:22-35; 1 Corinthians 12:28; 2 Corinthians 12:12; Galatians 2:7-10; Ephesians 4:11-14

**CRAFTSMANSHIP:** The gift of craftsmanship is the divine strength or ability to plan, build, and work with your hands in construction environments to accomplish multiple ministry applications. Exodus 30:22, 31:3-11; 2 Chronicles 34:9-13; Acts 18:2-3

**DISCERNMENT:** The gift of discernment is the divine strength or ability to spiritually identify falsehood, to distinguish between right and wrong motives, and the spiritual forces at work in situations. Matthew 16:21-23; Acts 5:1-11, 16:16-18; 1 Corinthians 12:10; 1 John 4:1-6

**EVANGELISM:** The gift of evangelism is the divine strength or ability to help non-Christians take the necessary steps to becoming a born-again Christian. Acts 8:5-6, 8:26-40, 14:21, 21:8; Ephesians 4:11-14

**EXHORTATION:** The gift of exhortation is the divine strength or ability to strengthen, comfort, or urge others to action through the written or spoken word and biblical truth. Acts 14:22; Romans 12:8; 1 Timothy 4:13; Hebrews 10:24-25

EAITH: The gift of faith is the divine strength or ability to believe in God for unseen supernatural results in every arena of life. Acts 11:22-24; Romans 4:18-21; 1 Corinthians 12:9; Hebrews 11

**GIVING:** The gift of giving is the divine strength or ability to produce wealth and to give by tithes and offerings for the purpose of advancing the Kingdom of God on earth. Mark 12:41-44; Romans 12:8; 2 Corinthians 8:1-7. 9:2-7 65

**IFICALING:** The gift of healing is the divine strength or ability to act as an intermediary in faith, prayer, and by the laying-on of hands for the healing of physical, mental, and spiritual sickness.

Acts 3:1-10, 9:32-35, 28:7-10; 1 Corinthians 12:9, 28

ACLPS: The gift of helps is the divine strength or ability to work in a supportive role for the accomplishment of tasks in Christian ministry with the ability to often see the need before others do. Mark 15:40-41; Acts 9:36; Romans 16:1-2; 1 Corinthians 12:28

**HOSPITALITY:** The gift of hospitality is the divine strength or ability to create warm, welcoming environments for others in places such as your home, office, or church. Acts 16:14-15; Romans 12:13, 16:23; Hebrews 13:1-2; 1 Peter 4:9

INTERCESSION: The gift of intercession is the divine strength or ability to stand in the gap in prayer for someone, something, or some place, believing for profound results. Hebrews 7:25; Colossians 1:9-12, 4:12-13; James 5:14-16

**WORD OF KNOWLEDGE:** The gift of the word of knowledge is the divine strength or ability to bring truth to a situation by supernatural revelation. This is often accompanied by a word from God. Acts 5:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:8; Colossians 2:2-3

**LEADERSHIP:** The gift of leadership is the divine strength or ability to influence people at their level while directing and focusing them on the big picture, vision, or idea. Romans 12:8; 1 Timothy 3:1-13, 5:17; Hebrews 13:17

MERCY: The gift of mercy is the divine strength or ability to feel empathy and to care for those who are hurting in any way. Matthew 9:35-36; Mark 9:41; Romans 12:8; 1 Thessalonians 5:14

MIRACLES: The gift of miracles is the divine strength or ability to alter the natural outcomes of life in a supernatural way through prayer, faith, and divine direction. Acts 9:36-42, 19:11-12, 20:7-12; Romans 15:18-19; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 28

**PASTOR/SHEPHERD:** The gift of pastor is the divine strength or ability to care for the personal needs of others by nurturing and mending life issues. John 10:1-18; Ephesians 4:11-14; 1 Timothy 3:1-7; 1 Peter 5:1-3

**PROPHECY:** The gift of prophecy is the divine strength or ability to communicate God's truth and heart in a way that calls people to a right relationship with God. Acts 2:37-40, 7:51-53, 26:24-29; 1 Corinthians 14:1-4; 1 Thessalonians 1:5

**SERVICE:** The gift of serving is the divine strength or ability to do small or great tasks in working for the overall good of the body of Christ. Acts 6:1-7; Romans 12:7; Galatians 6:10; 1 Timothy 1:16-18; Titus 3:14

**TEACHING:** The gift of teaching is the divine strength or ability to study and learn from the scriptures primarily to bring understanding and depth to other Christians. Acts 18:24-28, 20:20-21; 1 Corinthians 12:28; Ephesians 4:11-14

**TONGUES** (AND INTERPRETATION): The gift of tongues is the divine strength or ability to pray in a heavenly language to encourage your spirit and to commune with God. The gift of tongues is often accompanied by interpretation and should be used appropriately. Acts 2:1-13; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 14:1-14

**WORD OF WISDOM:** The gift of the word of wisdom is the divine strength or ability to understand and bring clarity to situations and circumstances often through applying the truths of Scripture in a practical way. Acts 6:3, 10; 1 Corinthians 2:6-13, 12:8
