| SIGNIFICANCE | |
| When God descended to Mount Sinai to talk with Moses and the people of Israel, the people responded with fear and trembling (Exodus 20:18-21). However, the author of Hebrews instructs believers that because of Jesus, that is not the case anymore. | |
| Jesus—the better Moses, sacrifice, High Priest, mediator, and blood of the covenant—makes it possible for believers to stand confidently in the presence of God and Jesus at the foot of the heavenly Mount Zion. Because of Jesus, fear and trembling have been transformed into joyful celebration. | |
