KEY REFERENCE	
After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sightThen the apostles returned to Jerusalem from the hill called the Mount of Olives, a Sabbath day's walk from the city. -Acts 1:9,12	
After being crucified and resurrected, Jesus ascended from the Mount of Olives to the presence of God the Father. As Jesus was exalted, he rightfully took his place sitting at the Father's right hand (Hebrews 1:3).	
Jesus reigns as King because the Father has given him all authority and dominion on heaven and earth (Matthew 28:20). As believers wait for Jesus's second coming, they participate in the mission of the kingdom to be witnesses of the good news of Jesus to all nations (Acts 1:8).
