Course Syllabus: Systematic Theology

Instructors: Pastors Mike Sage, Ancel Presnell, Jody Jenkins

Introduction: As given on page 1 of the textbook, Systematic Theology is any study that answers the question, "What does the whole Bible teach us today?" about any given topic.

Purpose: The purpose of this course is to help students to equip students with a coherent understanding of Christian doctrine by systematically studying the teachings of Scripture. Emphasizing the authority of the Bible, the course prepares students to articulate and apply biblical doctrine faithfully in the life of the church and the world.

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Course Syllabus: Biblical Hermeneutics Semester 1

Instructors: Pastors Mike Sage, Ansel Presnell, Jody Jenkins

Introduction: Biblical hermeneutics is the disciplined study of the principles and methods used to interpret Scripture in order to understand the intended meaning of the biblical text as communicated by the original authors, to the original audience, in its historical, literary, and theological context, and to apply that meaning responsibly today.

Purpose: The purpose of this course is to equip students with the knowledge, skills, and spiritual discernment necessary to interpret Scripture faithfully and responsibly. Students will learn to identify the original meaning of biblical texts by examining historical, cultural, literary, and theological contexts. Through this course, students should develop the ability to distinguish sound interpretation from misinterpretation, evaluate interpretive methods critically, and apply biblical truths appropriately. Ultimately, the course aims to foster confidence, humility, and faithfulness in handling the Word of God.
