# "Planned Parenthood, ... Egyptian Style"

Exodus 1: (6-14) 15 – 22

Introduction:

# In Exodus chapter one, we see:

- I. <u>the legalization of selective murder and it's advancement</u>. (1:15 16)
  - A. <u>Pharaoh's **first plan** was implemented **openly**. (1:9 – 10a, 11a)</u>
  - B. <u>Pharaoh's second plan was implemented secretly.</u> (1:15 16)

## Secondly, ... we see in this passage that:

II. <u>the law of God superseds the law of man.</u> (1:17)

#### Biblical Examples:

- 1 Samuel 19:1 5
- Daniel 3:16 18
- Daniel 6:1 10
- Acts 4:18 20

When man's law <u>demands</u> for us <u>to do</u> what God <u>forbids</u>, ... or when man's law <u>forbids</u> us <u>to do</u> what God <u>commands</u> us to do, ... we must <u>obey</u> God rather than <u>man</u>.

# The midwives understood – <u>The Law of God</u> supersedes *the law of man*.

Exodus 1:18 - 19

# How does God respond to those who refuse to kill the innocent baby boys?

- III. The Lord honors and rewards obedience. (1:20 21)
  - A. <u>He blessed the Israelites and they became even more numerous.</u> (1:20)
  - B. <u>He blessed the Hebrew **midwives** with **children** of their own. (1:21)</u>

Philippians 2:8

Philippians 2:9 – 11

# Just a brief comment concerning this last biblical truth:

IV. <u>sin, unchecked, becomes more embolden.</u> (1:22)

What was once spoken of and carried out in **secrecy**, ... is now **publicly** and **shamelessly** done and becomes the **law** of the **land**.

## Personal Application:

Let's look at some lessons, ... some "take-a-ways" that we've learned in this passage of Scripture:

- God believes in the sanctity of human life.
- Every **plan** that is laid in **opposition** to God's will, is ultimately doomed to **failure**. You can't deny an omnipotent God and win!
- The law of God supersedes the law of man.
- God honors obedience to Him, even though it might be imperfect.
- God is **merciful** on the sinner. He **sent** Jesus Christ, His only begotten Son, to **die** on the Cross for your **sin** and mine, satisfying God's **holy** and righteous demands. He (Jesus) is our **atoning** Sacrifice.
- Sin, ... left unchecked, becomes more embolden.
