11 kids (with wife, Sarah)

- 13 college presidents
- 65 college professors
- 75 military leaders
- 80 public servants
- 60 authors
- 60 doctors
- 30 judges
- 100 pastors
- 100 lawyers
- 3 US senators
- 1 US vice president
