## *Getting to Know Me Questions:*

- What is a story about our family that you think should never be forgotten?
- What was the most memorable trip you ever took with your family?

## *Into the Bible Questions:*

- What's something from this week's teaching that you learned, stood out, was interesting?
- This week we will focus on "Build Sacred." Building sacred means "holy/set apart," and it's often the most overlooked secret of keeping it together. This week, your group will discuss putting God at the center of your families to build a life that can withstand any trial or storm.
- Building sacred means learning to value what's truly important and dismissing things that aren't as meaningful.
- **READ:** Colossians 3:1-10
- How does this passage shape your thinking about the values of your family?
- In what ways have you made significant changes in your life as you have more deeply embraced your faith?
- How would you say what is sacred to you has shifted in your current season of life? (single, married, children, empty nesters, etc.)
- Do you find it difficult in your everyday life to live out sacred values? Why or why not?
- Holding a family together means agreeing on how you will do life as a family. Here are some sacred valued PK shared:
  - Togetherness – Being together not separate is the default
  - God First – Giving God the "first" in every area of your life
  - Authenticity – Lean on God, and practice authentic living
  - Gumption – Do your absolute best and push through challenges
  - Bless others – Use your resources to care for others whenever you can

- Which of these values particularly resonate with you, and why?

- What values would you add to this list for your family?

## *Application Questions:*

- We were challenged to take some time this week to define 5-7 things that are sacred in our life and family. Using the list from questions five & six, select one sacred value for your family and share with the group why it's important to you.
