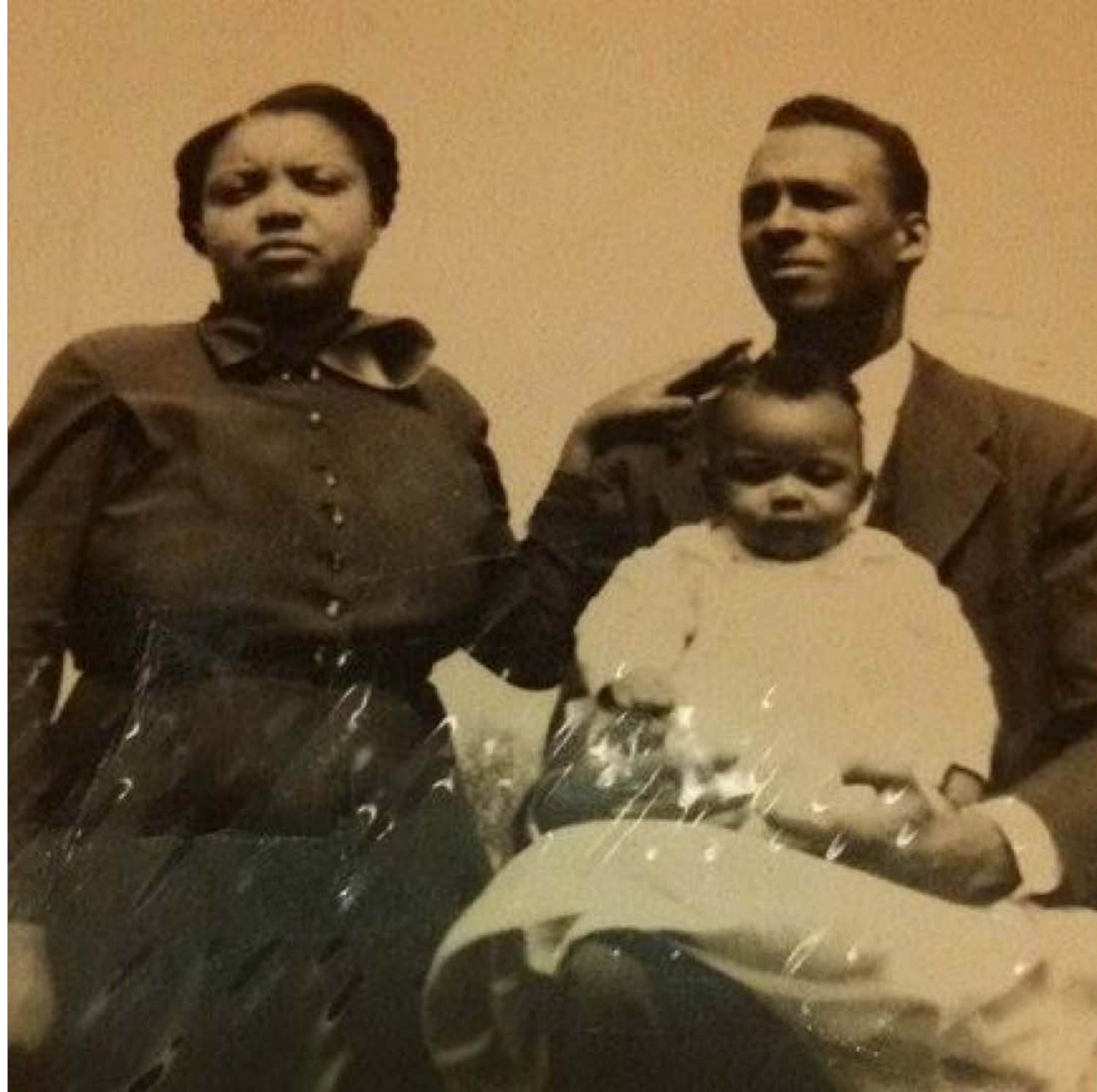


















# Died In Auto Crash



Mrs. Johnson and Mrs. Smith

Funeral services were held this morning for two women evangelists who were killed last week in a traffic accident on the Detroit-Toledo Expressway a mile south of Monroe, Michigan.

The victims were Mrs. Addie B. Smith, 38, of 852 Hamilton St., and Mrs. Maggie Johnson, 33, of 1328 Bronson Ave., both evangelists at Pinewood Faith Tabernacle, 535 Pinewood Ave.

The two women and three other occupants of the car in which they were riding were en route to the International Gospel Center, Ecorse, Michigan for a bible reading class.

Their car skidded 225 feet after passing a truck before it struck a cement bridge railing over LaPlaisance Creek. Both of the women died of crushed chests.

Charles A. Hill, 26, of 659 Avondale Ave., suffered head injuries and was admitted to Mercy Hospital at Monroe. Mrs. Smith's daughter, Alice, 15, suffered a broken arm. Mrs. Lillie Anderson, 39, of 1051 Pinewood, received broken ribs and a fractured

Mrs. Smith also was from Guntown and was a Toledo resident 13 years.

Also surviving are her husband, James, sons, Willie, Chicago and Bobby Gene, Toledo; daughter Alice Faye, Toledo; mother Mrs. Bessie Beene, Baldwin, Miss., and brother, Willie Bee Toledo.

Church services for Mrs. Johnson and Mrs. Smith was held Monday 12:00 at Third Baptist Church.

Burial for both was in Forest Cemetery.

Their bodies were transferred to Riverside Hospital after treatment in Monroe Hospital.

Mrs. Johnson was born in Guntown, Miss., and lived in Toledo for 10 years. She was employed as a nurse's aid at the Haven Nurse Home.

Surviving are her husband, Thomas, W.; sons, Thomas and Walter J.; daughter, Lullie, Lillian M., Emily G., Margaret J.; parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ozell Dornell; grandfather, Simon Dornell, and sisters, Lydia Norrils, all of Toledo.
