The Apostle John sets emphasis from the beginning of Revelation. The emphasis is not on what is to come but Who is to come. We must not diminish the importance of the revelation of these future events, but we must properly understand what is to come as a sovereign orchestration crescendoing for Who is to come. We will approach Revelation with a Christ-centric lens, "for the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy". (Rev. 19:10) Revelation is not written in mystery, but written plainly and clearly that all who read, hear, and keep what is written will be fully and completely blessed. The time is near. Jesus promised a return for his bride, and both John and Paul, in their epistles, encouraged the church to look for the blessed hope. Scripture is not vague, but clear concerning the imminence of the rapture and the need for us to prepare for it. Following the rapture, the seven year period called the tribulation will commence for all those who dwell upon the earth. It will be a time of salvation for the believing remnant of Israel <sup>5</sup> and judgement for the unbelieving world <sup>6</sup> . <sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Listed are all the topics that could be covered within the scripture text for that lecture. **Practically speaking**, not all the possible topics will be covered in the depth desired. Some topics will be condensed to a definition with summarized application to the class course as a whole.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Revelation 3:10 -- "Because you have kept my word about patient endurance, <u>I will keep you from the hour of trial</u> that is coming on the whole world, to try those who dwell on the earth." Revelation 4:1 begins with, "After this...". What is "after this" referring to? After the "...[things] that are..." (Rev. 1:19) The things that are is the present church age signified by the seven churches of Asia Minor in Revelation 2-3. "After this..." the church is not seen again until Revelation 19 at the Marriage of the Lamb. <sup>3</sup> For the sake of practicality, the focus may remain on Midtribulation vs Pretribulation with a brief mention and definition for the other two positions.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> "<u>The marriage of the Lamb is an event that has particular reference to the church and takes place in heaven. The marriage supper is an event that involves Israel and takes place on the earth. In Matthew 22:1-14; Luke 14:16-24; and Matthew 25:1-13, where Israel is awaiting the return of the bridegroom and the bride, the wedding feast or supper is located on the earth and has particular reference to Israel. The wedding supper, then, becomes the parabolic picture of the entire millennial age to which Israel will be invited during the tribulation period, which invitation many will reject and so they will be cast out, and many will accept and they will be received in. Because of the rejection the invitation will likewise go to the Gentiles so that many of them will be included. Israel, at the second advent, will be waiting for the Bridegroom to come from the wedding ceremony and invite them to that supper, at which the Bridegroom will introduce His bride to His friends (Matt. 25:1-13)." The Throne is central to Revelation 4 and 5, being mentioned 19 times. From this same Throne, toward which worship ascends, judgment will descend to the earth during the time of tribulation. Make no mistakeGod is the author and executor of all that befalls those who dwell upon the earth. The Lamb opens the seven-sealed title deed to the earth commencing the complete sovereign judgment of God toward an unbelieving world. The seals are ready to be broken. The seals of the scroll take place one after the other and will cover the entire tribulation period. The opening of the seventh seal unveils more intense judgments, prior to which the silence in heaven is a reminder that in judgment the Lamb has not forgotten mercy. (Hab. 3:2) Following the seventh seal, the seven angels holding seven trumpets are prepared to sound their trumpets from heaven toward earth. These judgments are greater in intensity than the seven seals and will be released in the last half of the 70th week <sup>8</sup> . The two witnesses, whose ministry in Jerusalem will wreak havoc upon the earth, will be martyred before they are resurrected and ascend to heaven. These witnesses are one more reminder that the Lamb has not forgotten mercy in the midst of judgement. This gospel will be preached to every creature. Seven actors are identified and described. These cosmic actors remind us there has been a long war against God. The Victor and the foes have existed long before our time and will engage in conflict as the future becomes the present. Again, the mercy of God is on display as three angels fly throughout the sky sharing the eternal gospel. (Rev. 14:6) The work of all the evangelists throughout the tribulation is rewarded as a large host receives rest in heaven. (Rev. 14:12-13) After the last interval we are very near the revelation of Jesus Christ as the conquering King, for this Gospel has been preached throughout the whole world. 
<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>7</sup> The Book of Revelation is dramatic, this portion is no exception. Revelation is a book for the head and for the heart. John's emotions are on display as he stands before the Throne of the Almighty. <sup>8</sup> "Chapters 1-3 present the development of the church in this present age. Chapters 4-11 cover the events of the entire seventieth week period and conclude with the return of Christ to the earth to reign in 11:15-18. <u>Thus the seals are the events of the first three</u> and one-half years and the trumpets events of the last three and one-half years." *Pentecost, J. Dwight; Things to Come, pg. 215* <sup>9</sup> "According to the instructions given John in 10:11, chapter 12-19 survey the seventieth week a second time, this time with a view to revealing the actors on the stage of the drama." *Pentecost, J. These are poured out in the final months of the Great Tribulation <sup>10</sup> , just prior to the Return of the King. We will trace the origins of the religious and the political system of man symbolized in the Great Whore and the Great City of Babylon. These two great symbols will receive the fullness of God's wrath through the bowl judgments. Enraged, the nations will set themselves against the Lord and His Anointed; but the Lord will have the final Word. <sup>&</sup>lt;sup>10</sup> "The third series of judgements, which complete the outpouring of divine wrath, are the vials (Rev. 16:1-21). Although four of these vials are poured out on the same areas as the trumpets, they do not seem to be the same judgments. The trumpets begin in the middle of the tribulation and depict events during the entire second half of the week. The vials seem to cover a very brief period at the end of the tribulation just prior to the second advent of Christ. These bowls seem to have particular reference to unbelievers, as they undergo the special wrath of God (16:9,11), and have special reference to the Beast and his followers (16:2)." *Pentecost, J. Dwight; Things to Come, pg. 363* 


<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>11</sup> At this time we will discuss how the "Gog and Magog" referenced in Revelation 20:8 represents all nations (Magog) and the ruler of those nations (Gog) and not a chronological placement of the battle with Gog and Magog. (Ezekiel 38-39) John Walvord writes: "In describing the nations, the term 'Gog and Magog' is used without any explanation. From the context it would seem that this is not the same event as that described in Ezekiel 38 and 39 where Gog and Magog are prominent; and the battle which follows is entirely different and separated by at least a thousand years from that of Ezekiel's prophecy." [John F. Walvoord, The Revelation of Jesus Christ (Galaxie Software, 2008), 302.] With this perspective D. Pentecost agrees. See Things To Come, pg. 344-355. Pentecost is joined by Charles L. Feinburg in his book, Revelation: The Grand Finale, pg. 146-147.



The contents of the seven sealed scroll are recognizing what is contained within, not necessarily a strict correlation to the timeline seen below. The seven seals contain all that befalls the earth until Christ returns to establish his kingdom.

Please see the timeline on page 6. It is an accurate chronological timeline of how the seals, trumpets, and bowls are dispensed throughout the tribulation.

## **EVENTS OF THE TRIBULATION PERIOD**
