Summary

Pastor Jamie delivers a sermon about the church's vision to help congregants become "winners in life" through understanding God's authentic love. He shares his personal journey of seeking a real relationship with God at age 17, emphasizing that life involves spiritual warfare between blessing and curse. On God's unchanging nature:

"Listen, what Jesus said, God said, I change not. I'm the same yesterday, today, and forevermore. And His word does not change based upon what the world around us looks like."

On personal choice and God's will:

"God does not determine everything in your life. You do. He said this, you have the power to choose life or death, blessing or cursing. He said, **you** choose life."

On his competitive nature and life philosophy:
