Summary

- 1. **Love is a choice, not a feeling** Agape love is a commandment that requires obedience regardless of emotions
- 2. **Acceptance ≠ Love** You can love someone deeply while not accepting or agreeing with their lifestyle, beliefs, or choices
- 3. **Hate in the heart equals murder** According to 1 John 3:15, harboring hatred makes one a murderer in God's eyes
- 4. **True love tells the truth** If you know someone is doing wrong and don't lovingly speak truth, you don't truly love them
- 5. **Don't cast pearls before swine** Wisdom means not arguing with predetermined opponents or wasting energy on fruitless debates
- 6. **Love without action is meaningless** Real agape love involves practical help (feeding, supporting, meeting needs)
- 7. **Political division threatens Christian unity** Both sides can become more political than spiritual
- 8. **Jesus must come first** Above any religion, political view, or social pressure, Jesus is "the only way"
- 9. **Wisdom in confrontation** You can stand for truth without becoming a fool through endless arguments
