Chip Dodd—

Discuss:

1. Read the Dodd quote (above) and discuss. Do you agree or disagree? Why did Pastor Patrick cite this on *Mother's Day?* Why the subject of sadness on such a holiday?

- 2. If you are comfortable, what is *Mother's Day* like for you personally? Is it a day of celebration or is it hard? Why?
- 3. Read Genesis 23:1-20 and discuss. Pastor Patrick said the story of Sarah helps on a holiday where experiences vary so vastly. In what ways might Sarah's story help?
- 4. In what ways might Genesis 23 speak to the value of human life? How is the value of human life supported by the text?
- 5. In what ways did Abraham honor Sarah's life and legacy?
- 6. Looking back over the covenant between God and Abraham, why is this particular story so important?
- 7. Read Hebrews 11:8-16 and discuss. What stands out to you in relation to the story in Genesis 23?
- 8. What immediate applications can be made in light of this text?
- 9. What question do you still have?
