

Genesis 25:1-18; 1 Peter 1:1-9

"'Obtaining the Outcome of Your Faith"

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Consult the Scriptures:

Genesis 25:1-18 1 Peter 1:1-9

(Other Scripture referenced: Gen. 17:4-6, 15:13-15; Rev. 3:5; Jn. 10:27-29; Gal. 5:22-23; Heb. 12:28-29)

Discuss:

- 1. What does it mean to be secure (think holistically: physically, spiritually, and emotionally)? As people, how important is security on a scale of 1-10 (10 being the highest)? Why?
- 2. What are some of the things that leave us feeling the most insecure?
- 3. In terms of faith, how secure can we be? Read 1 Peter 1:1-9 and discuss. What reasons does this passage give concerning our security in Christ? What is difficult for you to believe in this passage?
- 4. Wayne Grudem offers the following three questions to ask when determining whether or not one's faith is genuine:

- o (1) Do I have a *present* trust in Christ for salvation?
- o (2) Is there evidence of a regenerating (transforming) work of the Holy Spirit in my heart?
- o (3) Do I see a long-term pattern of growth in my Christian life?

If your faith is genuine, then what is promised in 1 Pet. 1? What about the rest of Scripture?

- 5. Read Genesis 25:1-18 and discuss. Looking back over Abraham's life, what stands out to you? Was Abraham's faith "genuine?" Why or why not?
- 6. Gen. 25:8 says Abraham died at "a good old age." Why is it important that Moses provide us with that detail (see Gen. 15:15)? What does that tell us about the promises of God? Does that affect our security at all? In what ways?
- 7. Why the list of names outside the line of Isaac (ref. 25:1-4, 12-18)? Why might this be important (see Gen. 17:4-6, 12:3)?
- 8. What immediate applications can be made in light of this text?
- 9. What question do you still have?
